Put some water in three bowls – put one bowl outside in the sunshine, one on a window sill and one in a shaded area inside your house. Do this in the morning and in the evening compare the bowls, which has evaporated the quickest?  Remember to make a test fair you only change one thing – the place where you put the bowl – so you must use the same type of bowl and the same amount of water. <u>RE</u> – New Life – The Holy Spirit game Paul new life and happiness:

#### Read 2 Corinthians 6: 3 – 10

This tells us about how Paul felt and how he kept going on his travels. Paul is a very important person in the early Church. He wrote many letters to encourage and advise others. Corinth was a city in Greece. In his letters to the Corinthians, Paul is stern in dealing with problems and encouraging too. The letters show how the Good News is given throughout the early Church.

I've had to put up with all sorts of things — dangers and hard times and all sorts of difficulties; I've been flogged, put in prison and beaten up; I've had to work like a slave, go without sleep and food. People have sometimes honoured me, and sometimes insulted me; sometimes praised me, and sometimes blamed me. They thought I was lying, yet I always tried to tell the truth; they called me a nobody, yet everybody knew me; my life wasn't worth living, yet I have enjoyed every moment of it; I've had a rough time, yet they haven't finished me off; many things have made me sad, yet I've been a very happy man.
