Project Work - History

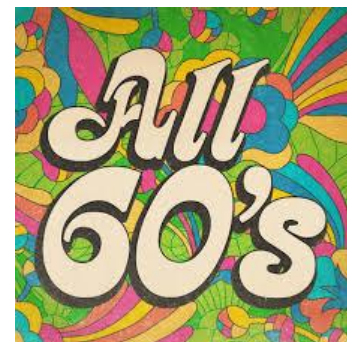
Over the next couple of weeks we thought it would be fun to start a project. This is based on any decade you choose. Eg: 80's, 90's etc.
