

SPORTS PREMIUM

Somers Park will receive an additional sum of £10,000 from the government during 15-16 to develop and sustain our sports teaching, learning and achievement. The fund will be utilised as follows:

1.
 - Coaching courses in areas where individual staff have an identified need. Teachers will achieve recognised qualifications.
 - “Fussball” coaching will be purchased for Y2/3 pupils.
 - La Crosse coaching for Y6 pupil to match our link with The Key School, USA
 - The University will undertake “Quality Assurance” for Somers Park for Sports Coaching during 13-14

2. We will employ a fully trained coach qualified to Masters level in Sports science. The coach will:
 - Work with pupils and groups during lessons.
 - Lead PE and Sports throughout the school
 - Train teachers in sport and PE coaching
 - Manage school PE budget
 - Support extra- curricular sports clubs
 - Lead school with competitive games
 - Order and organise sports equipment.
 - Write schools PE action plan
 - Participate in school Well Being programme.
 - Ensure a “Sport for All” ethos and promoting inclusive participation, with health and well for all students.

3. Develop further participation in competitive games by:
 - Participating in South Worcestershire tournaments
 - Entering the “Golden Trophy” at Bromyard
 - Organising home and away fixtures against other schools.
 - Ensure pupils are educated to become highly competitive in teams, as well as seeking self- improvement , and possess a sporting attitude of the highest excellence that respects other teams/competitors and referees

4. Target Upper Key Stage 2 pupils who may not be able to swim 25 metres by the end of year 6 for swimming lessons.

5. Somers Park has added £5000 to the project to fund further equipment.

6. Wrap Around Sports Premium: The employed sports coach to lead physical sessions during wrap around care.

7. Cycling
 - Allocate £1,500 to subsidise by 50% “bikeability” training for Y4 & Y5 pupil

8. Events

- Whole school “Wheely Fun” day – all cycling at school day.
- KS2 walk up and across Malvern Hills
- KS1 fields walk
- Kindergarten grounds walk.

9. Provide grants for pupils from pupil premium, special needs or safeguarded backgrounds, where school has assessed a specific need, to ensure all have equality of access to sporting development.
