## SCHOOL UNIFORM REGULATIONS

### (BOYS – YEARS 7 TO 11)

These are the school regulations on uniform and will be enforced by staff. If you have any questions about the uniform, please do not hesitate to contact the school through your child's Tutor or Head of House.

- ◆ **Stevensons**, 133-135 Victoria Street, St Albans are the official school outfitters and all items with the prefix "**School**" must be obtained from them. The school derives no profit from these sales. The school's uniform arrangements through Stevensons is governed by a service level agreement aimed at providing the best possible service to parents.
- ◆ All clothing, including shoes, must be plainly marked with name tapes.
- ◆ No jewellery to be worn.
- ◆ Hair must be in line with the current conventions for a smart office environment and therefore must not be extreme in style or length. It should not be cut shorter than a "number two" and must not be shave-patterned. This also applies to shaved eyebrows. Facial hair is not permitted in Years 7 to 11. Hair must be a natural colour and natural in appearance. Boys' hair in Years 7-11 may not extend below the bottom of the jacket collar, and hair should not obscure a student's eyes. If a breach of this code cannot be resolved to satisfaction of staff by sending a student home for the problem to be put right, it will result in internal removal of the student (including break and lunchtimes). Immediate responses to changes in hair fashions may require staff to apply their judgement to ensure appearances are acceptable and appropriate for school.
- ◆ Ties must be done up properly and reach the waistband of the trouser.

## UNIFORM LIST

### A In School

1. **School** tweed jacket.
2. **School** tie in House colour  
(Crosthwaite boarder students have their own distinctive tie)
3. **School** dark grey flannel type trousers. Straight legged not "flared" or "skinny" design
4. White shirt with long or short sleeves and a single breast pocket. The shirt must button to the neck and be worn with a tie in summer and winter.  
  
School Summer short sleeved shirt with embroidered pocket to be worn without jacket and tie in the Summer
5. **School** long sleeved mid-grey V-necked pullover with red stripes around the neck. (optional).
6. Plain dark grey socks.
7. Plain, black, polishable leather shoes. No boots or trainers or canvas shoes.

## **B Travelling to and from school**

1. **School** scarf (optional). This is the only scarf which students may wear around the School site.

## **C For Games and PE**

1. Games bag with zip fastener.
2. **School** rugby jersey (**new style**). Name tape to be sewn on outside collar.
3. **School** PE shirt in House colour (**new style**).
4. **School** bottle green rugby shorts (**new style**). Name tape to be sewn on outside bottom of leg.
5. **School** white PE shorts (**new style**).
6. Rugby boots, which must have 'kite mark' studs.
7. **School** red rugby socks.
8. White short socks.
9. Sports trainers.
10. Gumshield

**NB** All Games/PE kit, including trainers and boots must be named. Initials on clothing labels are not acceptable. Name tapes should be sewn on all items of clothing. Name tapes should be sewn onto the tongues of trainers and boots. Where this is impossible, indelible ink will be acceptable. After rugby lessons, boys will be expected to shower. It may be useful to include a plastic bag for wet and dirty kit.

**Teams only** Cricket (white trousers, white cricket shirt and white boots).  
**School** round neck tracksuit top (compulsory if selected for team)

Optional:

**School** bottle green PE Hoodie (**new style**)  
**School** round neck tracksuit top (optional if not in team)  
**School** tracksuit bottoms

## **D Technology (Food)**

**All pupils** study this subject and will require:

1. A 'butchers' striped apron in cotton drill (available from School Resources shop).
2. A named tea towel.
3. A basket for carrying all food resources to and from School. (It is also used for safe storage of pupils' resources in the Food Technology room.)

## **E Technology (CDT)**

1. A beige or white apron (available from School Resources shop).

## **F Science**

The School provides safety goggles with brow shields for pupils to carry out practical work in the laboratories.

**NB** Because of their ability to absorb gases which can damage the eye, soft contact lenses must not be worn in laboratories.

## **H Criteria for Awards and Grants**

The Government necessitous clothing allowance has now been discontinued and the School Governors, in order to offer support to eligible families, have agreed to fund their own scheme. Parents who are eligible for assistance from the necessitous clothing scheme will receive grants when their children are admitted to secondary school. Parents will not, however, be eligible for assistance at any other time. Claims must be made within three months of the child starting the school. Parents whose children receive free school meals qualify for assistance, which comes in the form of a cheque which is valid for two months from their date of issue. The maximum assistance given is £75. Please telephone the Finance Office if you would like further details of this scheme.

The School Parent/Staff Association also run periodic sales of second hand uniform items, including jackets/blazers. Details of dates when sales are planned will be published each summer. This can provide a very affordable way of acquiring items which are costly new.

Parents who are eligible for assistance with transport, school meals or music fees are asked to contact the Finance Office for the relevant forms.

## SCHOOL UNIFORM REGULATIONS

### (GIRLS – YEARS 7 TO 11)

These are the school regulations on uniform and will be enforced by staff. If you have any questions about the uniform, please do not hesitate to contact the school through your child's Tutor or Head of House.

- ◆ **Stevensons**, 133-135 Victoria Street, St Albans are the official school outfitters and all items with the prefix '**School**' must be obtained from them. The school derives no profit from these sales. The school's uniform arrangement through Stevensons is governed by a service level agreement aimed at providing the best possible service to parents.
- ◆ All clothing, including shoes, must be plainly marked with name tapes.
- ◆ No jewellery (this includes sleepers in pierced ears) or make-up to be worn.
- ◆ Hair must be appropriate for a smart office environment and must not be extreme in style or length. Hair must be a natural colour and natural in appearance and hair should not obscure a student's eyes. Eyebrows must not be shaved. Only plain, functional and safe hair accessories are allowed: senior staff can give guidance. If a breach of this code cannot be resolved to satisfaction of staff by sending a student home for the problem to be put right, it will result in internal removal of the student (including break and lunchtimes). Immediate responses to changes in hair fashions may require staff to apply their judgement to ensure appearances are acceptable and appropriate for school.
- ◆ Ties must be done up properly and reach the waistband of the skirt/trouser.

## UNIFORM LIST

### A In School

1. **School** blazer
2. **School** tie in House colour  
(Keswick boarder girls have their own distinctive tie).
3. **School** skirt which must be worn on the top of the knee.
4. White shirt with long or short sleeves which must have buttons to the neck and be worn with a tie in summer and winter. Girls may opt to wear a **School** reverse collar blouse between Easter and Autumn half term. This is worn untucked. Students who choose to wear this blouse must purchase from the School shop a House identifier badge to wear on the right lapel of their blazer.
5. **School** bottle green long sleeved jumper with red stripes around the neck (optional).
6. Plain black tights (40 denier) or white ankle socks (not trainer socks).
7. Plain, black, polishable leather shoes with a low heel (no more than two inches). Platforms to be no more than one inch. No boots or trainers.

## **B Travelling to and from school**

**School** scarf (optional). This is the only scarf students may wear around the School site.

## **C For Games and PE**

1. Games bag with zip fastener.
2. **School** games skort (**new style**). Name must be embroidered on the outside so that is clearly visible.
3. **School** PE shirt in House colour (**new style**).
4. **School** Lacrosse/Netball PE shirt in bottle green (**new style**).
5. **School** bottle green PE shorts (**new style**).
6. **School** red games socks.
7. Short white socks.
8. Lacrosse stick (available from the School).
9. Black lacrosse boots (football boots preferable).
10. Sports trainers.
11. Gumshield

**NB** All games/PE kit, including trainers and boots must be named. Initials on clothing labels is not acceptable. Name tapes should be sewn on all items of clothing. Name tapes should be sewn onto the tongues of trainers and boots. Where this is impossible, indelible ink will be acceptable.

**Teams:** **School** round neck tracksuit top (compulsory if selected for team)

**Optional** Tartan trousers (please see note)  
Lacrosse or boys goalkeeping gloves.  
**School** bottle green PE hoodie (**new style**)  
**School** round neck tracksuit top (optional if not in team)  
**School** tracksuit bottoms  
Black leggings

Girls trousers have been introduced as an optional uniform item. In most cases girls will wear a skirt exclusively but following a consultation last term, we have made provision for optional trousers to be made available.
