### School Nurse Drop In Sessions

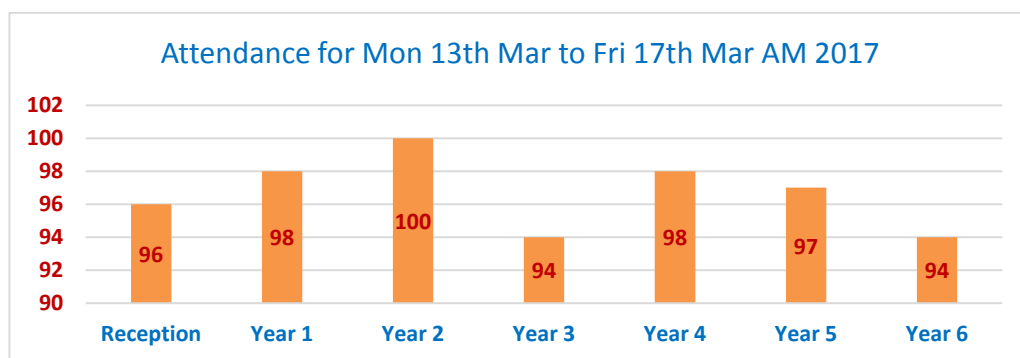
One of the school nursing team from the Borough will be holding Drop In sessions at school at 8.30-9.30am on the following dates:
