



The time there is 7 hours in front of us.</p> <p>Discuss why this could be a problem if you wanted to phone someone.</p> <p>At different times of the day check the time here and work out what time it would be in Hong Kong.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Senses</p> <p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>Street markets in Asia are huge, vibrant and busy, selling everything from colourful materials and clothes to handmade traditional crafts and souvenirs. Most have food markets selling exotic fruit, vegetables herbs and spices. You can buy a plate of steaming traditional food to eat.</p> <p>Imagine you are standing in the middle of a markets. Discuss what you can hear, smell and see. Use some imaginative adjectives (describing words).</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">How many Words?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">English/Geography</p> <p>There are 48 countries in Asia today. Choose one of them and see how many words you can make using only the letters in the name. There are less than 50,000 elephants in Asian countries.</p> <p>Create an information poster. Think about what they look like, what they eat, where they live and any other information you can find.</p>

They are used to do heavy work such as harvesting and logging.</p> <p>Make an elephant with junk model materials. How big can you make it? Will it stand up on its own? You could choose another animal that lives in Asia and make that.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Boats</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>Living in boats, on the waters of South East Asia, are people known as Mogens. They are nomadic communities in Burma, Thailand, Malaysia and Borneo. Make yourself a boat using whatever materials you can find.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Does it float?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">How can you make it even better?</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Float or Sink</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>Still thinking about Mogens who live on their boats – what would happen if they dropped something in the water? Get a bowl of water and some objects (carrot, key, paper, etc). Predict (think) will it float or sink. Try it. Were you right? You could do this in the bath.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Chopsticks</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Art</p> <p>China produces 45 billion pairs of chopsticks each year. (Try and imagine that amount).</p> <p>Draw the outline of a pair of chopsticks on a piece of paper. Now carefully draw delicate decoration onto your chopsticks and colour with bright colours.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Tip: Research drawings from China for ideas.</p>
