<p>Aboriginal art-Dot Painting Art</p> <p>There are several types of Aboriginal art and one of these is dot painting. Dot painting is made up of small dots of paint colours like yellow (representing the sun), brown (the soil), red (desert sand) and white (the clouds and the sky). These are traditional Aboriginal colours. The paintings were mostly images of animals or lakes. Using a cotton bud, can you create your own piece of Aboriginal art?</p> 	<p>The Great Barrier Reef Geography/Science</p> <p>Australia is home to the largest eco system in the world, the Great Barrier Reef. Sadly, this magnificent system is under threat. Your task is to create a poster that outlines these threats, e.g. the crown-of -thorns starfish. Include information about the threats and ways they can be managed or overcome. Your poster should be eye catchi  facts.</p>	<p>The Haka! PE / Dance</p> <p>The Haka is a traditional Māori dance and it is important to the native (indigenous) people of New Zealand. War haka were originally performed by warriors before a battle, proclaiming their strength and prowess in order to intimidate (worry) the opposition. It has been made famous by the All Blacks rugby team. The largest iceberg, on record, came from the Ross Ice Shelf in Antarctica and had a surface area of 11,000 km!</p> <p>Make your own iceberg and see how only 10% of an iceberg is above water! It is a guessing game originally played in the Mer Island in Queensland Australia. You need a cup and some small items e.g. Pebbles, buttons, marbles.</p> <p>The aim of the game is to correctly guess how many items are in the cup. You can only ask yes/no questions. Once the correct answer has been said the person who guessed correctly gets to put as many items in the cup as they want and the game starts again. Have fun!</p>
