
Who is Samuel Lister?

Reading

Reading a variety of genres and learning many skills in being able to respond to questions about reading, is our key focus.



An adult will listen to your child read at least once a fortnight. During these sessions your child will be asked a variety of questions, developing skills in interpreting texts and pictures. These are essential transferrable skills when undertaking independent tasks, responding to texts.

Regular reading at home will help improve your child's learning in all subjects. Please write a comment in their Reading Record Book and initial it.

When listening to your child read, just reading the words is not evidence of your child's understanding. Interact with the text; ask them questions about what they are reading; *What do you think might happen? How do they feel? What does this word mean?*

Geographers

Our geography unit links closely with our science unit focussing on materials. We will be exploring climates around the world and how this has an impact on the types of clothing worn in line with different locations around the world and seasonal changes. We will explore the reasons why some countries are hotter than others.

Historians

As Historians the children will learn about significant people in our local history learning about the people behind our school house names, David **Hockney**, Charlotte **Bronte**, Joseph **Priestley** and with a greater focus on Samuel **Lister**. To link in with our science unit looking at materials, we will explore the way in which Samuel Lister made an impactful contribution to the textile industry here in Bradford as well as his international connections to make this happen



Scientists

In our science lessons, we will investigate many activities related to the uses of a variety of materials. This unit lends itself seamlessly to our history theme based on the textile industry and Samuel Lister.

Spiritual Thinkers

In Religious Education we focus on a key question each half term which will require children to use deeper thinking to answer it. This term our Deep Question is **How does what believers do show what they believe?** The unit begins with the story of the Good Samaritan and lessons continue to develop a greater understanding that even though people may not look like you or share the same beliefs, we can help one another.
