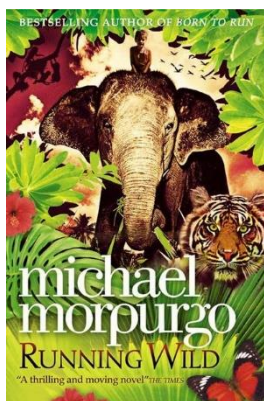


Dear Parents and Guardians

Welcome back after another lockdown! During the last half term, the children have been very busy catching up to close the gaps in their learning. They have been amazing and come back ready to learn!

This term, our new topic is 'I am a reader'. During this topic, we will be using the class reader, 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo. The medium-term plan outlines the activities and key skills that the children will be covering.



When undertaking this work, we will be focussing on giving the children many opportunities to develop their independent learning skills. We aim to cross curricular link all subjects so that children develop a breadth of knowledge, understanding and skills.

Promoting British Values - Statutory Requirement

At Bankfoot, we will promote British Values, defined by the government as the following: democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect, tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs.

We will be challenging pupils in debates where they will have the opportunity to express their opinions on the fundamental British Values below.

Tolerance - children will discuss how famous/influential people who are of different faiths, beliefs and backgrounds have influenced our History.

Mutual Respect - children will be taught the importance of respecting their own religion as well as others.

Rule of Law - we will explore the importance of following rules and laws within institutions and societies.

Individual Liberty - We will be encouraging children to look after their wellbeing, share their feelings and follow the correct procedures to report any concerns.

Democracy - this term we will be discussing many social issues such as working conditions and child poverty.

Geographers

As Geographers, we will be studying and learning the names of places and locating places (Countries, cities and towns) of United Kingdom. Use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps)

Historians

As historians, we will be studying the world's countries; using cultures to focus on the UK (including wider locations). We will also be looking at how traditions have changed over time and make comparisons to those of a different country.

Artists and Design Technologists

As artist, the children will demonstrate a range of Art and Design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture using a range of materials. As part of our topic – Pupils will be looking at reading resources and images to gain inspiration for Artwork.

Scientists

As Scientists, we will be studying and learning about electricity. Children will explore how electricity is used to make a light bulb light up and what a circuit consists of. We will also be looking at famous people who invented the concepts of electricity.

Spiritual Thinkers

We aim to offer a curriculum focussed on promoting pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development whilst suitably preparing them for life in this school, their next school and beyond.
