Sport Premium

The government has continued the Sport Premium funding for 2015-16, awarded to every state primary school in England. A lump sum for each school, with a per-pupil top-up for children in years 1-6, must be used in improving curricular and extra-curricular Physical Education. The funding objectives place great emphasis on improving the teaching and coaching for all children in Primary School education and therefore inspiring the Olympic and Paralympic stars of the future. This impact on the quality of teaching is also supposed to be sustainable for future generations. In addition to quality of teaching and learning, the Sport Premium funding can be used to encourage participation in a variety of after school clubs, intra school competitions or providing opportunities for children to experience a new sport.

The impact of Sport Premium spending can, if wisely used, benefit all pupils. Schools are required to publish information about their use of the Sport Premium on their website. Please do ask our Head teacher, Deputy Head Teacher or Assistant Head Teacher if you would like any further details.
