NC Objectives:

To produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences. To become proficient in sculpture techniques.

To evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design. To know about great artists, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art form.

Knowledge I already know

I know the basic proportions of the face: its oval shape and general proportions.

I know how to draw eyes and mouths accurately and with precision.

I know that the pencil's grade describes how soft the lead is and can make purposeful selections of pencil.

I know that artists use a wide range of techniques to create tone, form and texture, including shading, stippling, hatching, cross-hatching, random hatching and removing a media to create highlights.

Knowledge I will learn

Portraiture: I know that the edges of the nostrils line up with the tear ducts of the eyes.

Line, Tone and Form: I know that artists can use a wide range of techniques to create tone and form (including contour shading, contour hatching and scumbling)

Line: I know that lines can be used to create feeling and emotion in a composition (expressive line).

Colour: I know that monochrome is where a composition only uses different tones of a single colour.

Other: I know that media can be used together and overlapped for effect. This is called mixed media.

Artist in focus—Frank Auerbach



He was Jewish and was evacuated from Berlin to England during WW2. Both of his parents died in concentration camps.

He used both charcoal and paint.

In both media, his work is expressive and semi-abstract.

	Expressionism	A style of art where the artist is trying to communicate emotion rather that create an accurate image of the world.	
	Expressive line	Curved lines with lots of movement that follow less obvious paths. They often create movement, energy and emotion.	
	Scumbling	A form of mark making with several definitions. In drawing, scribble-like lines are overlapped to create texture and tone.	
	Contour shading	Shading (creating light and dark using a pencil) where the movements of the pencil follow the contours (form) of the object.	
	Contour hatching	A type of shading where hatching lines follow the contours (form) of the object.	
	Monochrome	Only using different tones of a single hue. Often used to describe work which is grayscale.	
	Mixed media	Where more than one media are used at the same time to create artwork. These may be overlapped for effect.	
	Physical texture	The texture you would experience if you were to touch the artwork.
