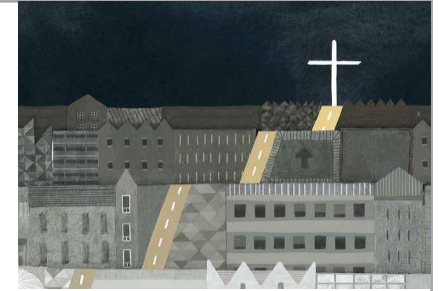














Our School Values
