

SIAMS Inspection Report

Last month SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools), report from the Church of England recognised that the school continues living up to its foundation as a Church school. The report highlights parents and carers speaking positively with regards to the impact of support they have, with one parent reporting 'our lives have been transformed'.

In addition it is recognised that the curriculum is shaped by the vision, it has been designed to provide 'guidance, wisdom and support for learning and life'. Pupils experience enriching and life enhancing opportunities to become confident, resourceful and resilient members of society.

The report shines with positivity further recognising how the school is creating a strong and united school community, with pupils being nurtured to look beyond themselves and to support others. They are given numerous opportunities to develop leadership skills and deepen their understanding of justice and responsibility through a variety of different roles. Significant strengths were recognised in:

- Psalm 23 underpins the school's Christian vision and inspires school leaders to create a
 welcoming, inclusive, and nurturing environment. As a result, they place a high priority
 upon the wellbeing and mental health of pupils and staff, enabling them to thrive.
- The school's vision has shaped the exciting and creative curriculum which includes a rich extra-curricular offer. Leaders provide pupils with 'everything they need' to develop. The school is well supported by the trust.
- The associated school values of love, unity, courage and inspiration enable the vision to be lived out practically. These values are used to inspire and equip pupils to embrace the numerous leadership responsibilities they are given. This empowers them to make positive changes within their school.
- The school community enjoys a strong partnership with St Aldhelm's Church. The clergy
 provide a visible presence within the school, assisting the spiritual flourishing of both
 pupils and staff.
- Religious education (RE) is given high priority within the school and is effectively supported by school leaders. Clear monitoring and assessment procedures keep leaders well informed of pupil progress and helps identify where further support for pupils is needed.

The report really does shine what Bishop Aldhelm's is about and it is a report that we should all be very proud of!
