Sport Premium

For 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 the government is providing Sport Premium funding to every state primary school in England. A lump sum for each school, with a perpupil top-up is awarded for these two years. The funding objectives place great emphasis on improving the teaching and coaching for all children in Primary School education and therefore inspiring the Olympic and Paralympic stars of the future. This impact on the quality of teaching is also supposed to be sustainable for future generations. In addition to quality of teaching and learning, the Sport Premium funding can be used to encourage participation in a variety of after school clubs, intra school competitions or to provide opportunities for children to experience a new sport.

The impact of Pupil Premium spending can, if wisely used, benefit all pupils.

Sport Premium Funding Outcomes

- To increase participation in sport and exercise opportunities within the school.
- To provide high quality coaches for all year groups across the school over the two year funding period.
- To provide high quality CPD for all staff who teach P.E. with a focus on understanding key fundamental movements and differentiation of tasks in lessons.
- To ensure that an emphasis is placed on the fundamental movement skills at both KS1 and KS2.
- To ensure that core skill areas such as, net and wall, gymnastics, dance and team games are progressed through high quality coaching and team teaching between the coach, teachers, higher level teaching assistants and teaching assistants.
- To ensure that the pupils at Bishop Aldhelm's Primary School receive the very best opportunities that this new funding can bring.
- Assessment of learning and implementing ICT in P.E. Lessons

Impact 2014 Autumn Term

- Teachers teaching good lessons with coaches supporting next steps and differentiated activities.
- Setting high expectations in every aspect of the teaching and learning of this subject.
- Planning and differentiation developed from last year's team teaching.
- Using ICT-I pads to shoot clips of differentiated activities, warm up, fundamental movement skills, speed, agility, quickness tasks.
