The struggle to build a good Muslim society

I can explain how history and culture can influence an individual and how some question these influences.

I can recognise what motivates me or influences me to lead a good life and compare it with what motivates and influences Muslims.

Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
The five pillars	They are the five key practices that all Muslims try to achieve throughout their lives
Shahadah	Muslim declaration of faith and the first Pillar of Islam
Salah	The practice of praying 5 times a day and the second Pillar of Islam
Zakah	Giving to the poor/charity work and the third pillar of Islam
Sawm	Fasting during the holy month of Ramadan and the fourth pillar of Islam
Haji	A pilgrimage to Mecca in Saudi Arabia which is the holiest city for Muslims and the fifth pillar is Islam
messenger	A prophet or person who is chosen by God to say the things God wants to tell people
fasting	To go without food or water from dawn to sunset
Jihad	A word used by Muslims to describe a struggle and the 'greater jihad' is the struggle to lead a good life and make a contribution to the goodness of society
Akhirah	A word used in Islam to describe the belief in everlasting life after death
