Free School Meal Information

If your circumstances have changed recently, you may be entitled to Free School Meals. This also means discounts on school uniform and school trips.

Or, if you will be joining us in September in Year 3 and you were entitled to Free School Meals in the infants, you will need to re-apply for Free School Meals for Giles Junior School.

You may qualify for FSM's if you receive any of the following:

- Income support
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- Child tax credit (providing you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Pension Credit
- Support under part V1 of the immigration and Asylum Act 1999.


