We ran a pupil survey last week and were thrilled with the results! 97% of pupils think the Headteacher and teachers do a good job! Hooray! The second highest result was 94% of pupils think the teachers are friendly and helpful. During the free text children had an opportunity to say what they liked best about Giles Junior and what we could do to improve. PE and kind teachers got a lot of mentions across the school. Other subjects such as art and maths were high on the agenda. Many children mentioned their desire to have more equipment or a climbing frame on the playground. There is good news on this front as we have scheduled the installation of some play equipment (January 2023).


3 Italy will have had a further notification explaining that Italy will be in a workshop until 2:50pm, at which point they will return to class to share their learning.

Come and visit the Travelling Book Fair! Browse and purchase books for your child, whilst at the same time helping us earn free books for our school.


The Book Fair will be in the school hall on:





In English, we are using the text 'My Strong Mind'. We are relaxing our minds using the rocking boats we made following instructions in English.

For Science, we introduced our new topic of Sound with a Sonic Sound Workshop. We learnt more about how sound travels through vibrations and how we hear sounds.














In Spanish we set up a cafe where we needed to use the vocabulary learnt in our previous unit to order items to eat.






A peek into ...
