I had the delight of walking past 4 Zambia who were busy making items to be sold at the Christmas Fayre (see previous letter from The Lighthouse Team) and was astonished by the high quality of their ornaments which were being made out of clay.

On Monday we had a visit from a school Headteacher from Latvia who was visiting schools who have embedded The Leader in Me into their curriculum. Mr Strautins hoped to take back ideas to enhance the implementation of the 7 Habits in his own school. He was astonished by the confidence of the class greeters who welcomed him into their classroom and told him what they were learning in class. The most impressive features he took from Giles Junior were the physical emotional bank account cups in each classroom, the class mission and class WIGs (Wildly Important Goals). I also enjoyed hearing about the different approaches from Latvia, where they have a curriculum rooted in technology for future career options (they are a secondary school).


During faith week last week, we walked to St Nicholas Church and learnt more about Christianity.





Last week was faith week and the children reflected on their own idea of belonging. Children then used art materials to draw, paint or construct their special spaces.






America A peek into ...
