#### Leader In Me

We had the exciting news that we have been re-certified as a flagship Leadership School for the Leader in Me! As we continue enhancing how we develop our pupils to use effective leadership strategies, we want to keep families up to date with what we are learning, so you might have the opportunity to talk to your own children about what they have learned and allow them to share their understanding. When we update you on our learning we may send home some complementary resources which allow you to take part in activities as a family relating to the different aspects of the 7 Habits. Please see below for the past two weeks learning on Habit 1 - Be Proactive.



#### 17th April 2023

We learned about six emotions and how to manage the intensity that occurs when feeling them. View this resource and invite your learner to share how they can notice when feeling some of the big emotions. We are working on developing a wider vocabulary with our children to help them identify what they are feeling so they can self-regulate more easily as a result of the intensity which they feel. We have looked at a wide vocabulary for the word sad e.g. desolate, crushed, miserable, glum, devastated, melancholy. Then we tried to order them to look at which ones would affect us the most and least. You could try this at home with any of the 6 emotions: sadness, happiness, anger, disgust, fear, surprise.

#### 24th April 2023

This week, we learned six self-regulation strategies: "Breathe," "Ask for Help," "Connect," "Move," "Take a Break," and "Use Your Senses." View the attached resource and create a pause plan for everyone to use at home!

#### **World Art Day**






#### **Year 5 Boys Football Festival**

#### Year 5 Trip to The Tower of London

On Tuesday, Year 5 set off on an expedition to one of London's most popular tourist attractions - The Tower of London.

As part of Year 5's History topic 'Crime and Punishment' The Tower of London picks up from where we last stepped into History with William the Conqueror building the Tower of London after his victorious battle in 1066 which ended the Anglo-Saxon period in British history. Since 1070, The Tower of London has served as a fortress, a royal residence, a prison, the royal mint, a public records office, an observatory, a military barracks, a place of execution, and the city zoo.

The children had an amazing time exploring The Tower of London and delving in to its past - we even had time to take in some of London's top sights before heading back to school.

#### **Swimming**

Swimming is currently taking place this school year for the whole of Year 5, giving each class two terms of swimming. All children in the year group take part even if children can already swim, as there is higher level testing available which incorporates further advanced swimming skills, which children can clearly benefit from.

Swimming has started this term for Year 5 Finland and Year 5 Turkey. This is a reminder of the rota for the year :

(these classes will be year 6 at this point)

## Science Experiments at Nobel for Year 5 Wednesday 3rd May

On Wednesday 3rd of May, Year 5 will visit Nobel School (during the school day). The children, along with their class teachers, will be participating in practical experiments with the Science Lead in their laboratories. Whilst the sessions will take place during the school day, please provide your child with a packed lunch on this day as we will be offsite during the year group's normal allocated lunchtime. If your child is in receipt of Free School Meals and will need a lunch provided for them, this can be ordered at school in the morning as usual. Year 5 Finland and Turkey will be dropped to Nobel straight after their swimming lesson and then will be walking back to Giles after their Science session.
