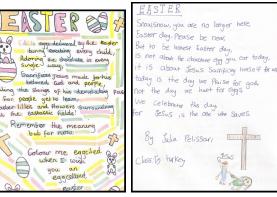


#### **Easter Poetry Competition**

#### New Lunch Menu for the Summer Term



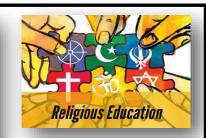
There is a copy of this menu on our website under the parents tab, then click on school meals. This menu will be running from 17th April through to the end of October 2023.

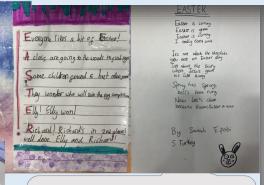




In PSHE and Food Tech, we've been looking at healthy eating and the benefits of doing so. This has resulted in some amazing salads and pizza wraps!





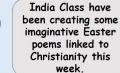


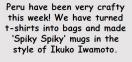
Year 5 have been creating ingenious and inventive Easter poems for the annual Easter poetry competition.
