WW2 (Local History Unit)

National Curriculum reference

Local history study –a study of an aspect of history dating from a period beyond 1066 that is significant to the locality.

Knowledge

- Know events leading up to and causing WW2 (specific links to the Treaty of Versailles and Adolf)
- Understand how WW2 effected the local area (Stevenage/Hertfordshire) and compare this to how it affected London (specific focus on what people did to prepare for and how they coped curing)
- Know key events of WW2 and where place chronologically on a timeline (specific focus when the war started, when it finished and VE day)
- Understand what the Blitz was (5W's) and how this impacted the local area. Compare this to London.
- Understand what evacuation was, who was evacuated and why this was necessary. Link to the local area and compare with London.
- Understand how the local area was impacted after WW2 and compare with London.

Skills

- Regularly address and devise historically valid questions about change, cause, similarity, difference and significance.
- Use vocabulary/terminology correctly.
- Be able to explain and justify past events and their cause and effect, using evidence to write an explanation.
- Gather knowledge from a range of sources, identifying which are primary and which are secondary.
- Record and communicate knowledge accurately. Use this knowledge to inform well thought out debates.
- Make connections between a historical period and present, and be able to link to the local area.
- Confidently use knowledge of chronology to plot current time on a timeline and sequence key events.
- Securely select, record and organise relevant information.

Ancient Maya

National Curriculum reference

A non-European society that provides contrasts with British history.

Knowledge

- Understand who the Mayans were and where they lived.
- Understand that the civilisation was discovered hundreds of years after it had finished by Spanish conquistadors.
- Understand the difference between primary and secondary sources and their reliability.
- Understand that the Mayan society ran on a hierarchal system and that different types of people had very different roles and responsibilities.
- Be able to identify key figures within the Mayan civilisation and understand the role they played and their importance.
- Know the religious beliefs of the Mayan people
- Explain how the Mayans invented and used their calendars and number systems.
- Understand the food that Mayans ate and why some were significant.

Skills

- Make clear connections between historical periods and the present, understanding how the past has influenced our lives today specifically linking to the Ancient Egyptian period (identifying similarities and differences between the two).
- Be able to confidently use a knowledge of chronology, including the timeline for a specific period and place in history.
