Budget allocation

School allocation - £ 18,390 + £5,460 from Government funding

At Giles Junior School PE and Sports provision is of the highest quality, with a PE specialist Teacher and a newly employed Sports Apprentice working alongside during PE lessons and Sport Clubs sessions.

Our school has achieved the Gold Quality Mark from "School Games" (SG) for the attainments in the school year 17/18. The SG is a unique opportunity to motivate and inspire millions of young people across the country to take part in more competitive school sport.

The SG Mark is a Government led awards scheme which rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school community.

<p>The PE teacher is training several members of staff to raise the standards within this subject.</p> <p>The school has employed a Sports Apprentice</p>	<p>All PE lessons are run by two members of staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lesson organisation is set up so that pupils have two different stations (at least) and are instructed in smaller groups. • Pupils are much more active during the lesson, spend less time waiting. • In Years 5 and 6 and Initial Assessment is done, every time there's a new sport being taught. After that, pupils are divided in two different sets in order to work similar objectives in accordance with their progression stage. At the end of the Half Term a Final Assessment is done to check pupil's progress. • Pupil voice reflects higher level of enjoyment for this subject. • Termly fitness tests reflect an increase in levels of fitness skills throughout the school. • £5,460 for the Sports Apprentice annual salary •
<p>High number of sport clubs on offer to pupils (13 in total across the year)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Numbers of pupils attending Sport Clubs last year (17/18) was 180 what represents 69% of all school pupils (261). This year (18/19), by the end of Autumn Term, the total number of pupils registered and attending the clubs is 178 (some pupils attend more than 1 sport club). • Pupil voice indicates pupils' level of enjoyment of Sport Clubs is high. • 12 of these Sport Clubs are free of charge to all pupils.

<p>Networking with other schools - set up a wide range of sport events with local schools.</p> <p>Through the new Sports League and also the internal sport events map, the current Year 3&4 will start to take part in sport events on Spring and Summer Term.</p> <p>Increase the numbers of pupils' participation in Sport Events for 18/19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Sports League - North Stevenage Primary Schools League - including 4 different sports, has been created in collaboration with schools in the local community (Giles; Trotts Hill; The Leys; Round Diamond; Martins Wood and Almond Hill). Last Year (17/18) 42.5% of all Year 3 and 4 pupils took part in 2 or more Inter/Intra-schools sport events [<i>100% for just 1 sport event</i>]. 52.2% of all Year 5 and 6 pupils have also taken part in 2 or more Inter/Intra-schools sport events [<i>100% for just 1 sport event</i>].
