


Behaviour


Home Reading

Your child should fill in their reading record each day with a comment about their reading book and how many pages they read.




Home-Learning

- 3 writing tasks


This needs to be handed in by the final Wednesday of half term. Teachers will not give feedback on homework, but there will be a celebration event for those that complete it each half term.




Parent Workshops/ Volunteering

These will be based around a variety of topics from keeping your children safe online to mental health and wellbeing.




