Behaviour






Home-Learning



Children in Year 1 - 6 will receive an **optional** pack of home learning each half term. This will contain:


- Weekly spellings

This needs to be handed in by the final Wednesday of half term. **Teachers will not give feedback on homework**, but there will be a celebration event for those that complete it each half term.







Parent Workshops/ Volunteering
