





Behaviour









Home Reading

In KS2 the expectation is to read 25 minutes each day




Children in Year 1 - 6 will receive a pack of home learning each half term. This will contain:


Parent Workshops/ Volunteering

These will be based around a variety of topics from keeping your children safe online to mental health and wellbeing.


