





Behaviour




Home-Learning

- 3 writing tasks


This needs to be handed in by the final Wednesday of half term. Teachers will not give feedback on homework, but there will be a celebration event for those that complete it each half term.



SATs




- The 2024 Key Stage 2 SATs will take place in the week commencing 13th May 2024.


Parent Workshops/ Volunteering

These will be based around a variety of topics from keeping your children safe online to mental health and wellbeing.




