We will be learning about animals and their habitats in both science and geography and we will be linking this theme to RE and art as well to get our creative juices flowing. We will be learning about different habitats around the world and then carrying out a variety of activities, to show our findings with whatever resources you have in your homes, gardens and wherever our daily walk takes us!

As you already know, in Literacy, we will be going way into the wild- (in fact, into space!) with the story 'Man on the Moon- a day in the life of Bob'. The children will be carrying out a variety of writing styles, including descriptions, instructions and story writing linked to the story. I will be asking, as ever, for the children to 'show off' their writing skills of using conjunctions, extended sentences, noun phrases and all of the punctuation we have learnt in year 2.
