1. Aims

Schools are required under the Equality Act 2010 to have an accessibility plan. The purpose of the plan is to:

- Increase the extent to which disabled pupils can participate in the curriculum
- > Improve the physical environment of the school to enable disabled pupils to take better advantage of education, benefits, facilities and services provided
- > Improve the availability of accessible information to disabled pupils

Our school aims to treat all its pupils fairly and with respect. This involves providing access and opportunities for all pupils without discrimination of any kind.

St Mary's Church of England Primary School is a one-form entry school for children between the ages of 3 and 11 years.

We are an ambitious and caring school and aim to make a real difference to the children who come here. We work in partnership with parents, St Mary's Church and the local community to ensure our pupils are able to make the best possible progress in ALL aspects of their learning.

The staff, governors, parents and pupils are fully committed to our vision of 'Excellence Together, Learning through Faith', ensuring each child is valued and reaches their full potential.

Our school is also committed to ensuring staff are trained in equality issues with reference to the Equality Act 2010, including understanding disability issues.

The school supports any available partnerships to develop and implement the plan.

Our school's complaints procedure covers the accessibility plan. If you have any concerns relating to accessibility in school, the complaints procedure sets out the process for raising these concerns.

We have included a range of stakeholders in the development of this accessibility plan, including staff and governors of the school.

2. Legislation and guidance

This document meets the requirements of <u>schedule 10 of the Equality Act 2010</u> and the Department for Education (DfE) guidance for schools on the Equality Act 2010.

The Equality Act 2010 defines an individual as disabled if they have a physical or mental impairment that has a 'substantial' and 'long-term' adverse effect on their ability to undertake normal day to day activities.

Under the <u>Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) Code of Practice</u>, 'long-term' is defined as 'a year or more' and 'substantial' is defined as 'more than minor or trivial'. The definition includes sensory impairments such as those affecting sight or hearing, and long-term health conditions such as asthma, diabetes, epilepsy and cancer.

Schools are required to make 'reasonable adjustments' for pupils with disabilities under the Equality Act 2010, to alleviate any substantial disadvantage that a disabled pupil faces in comparison with non-disabled pupils. This can include, for example, the provision of an auxiliary aid or adjustments to premises.

3. Current Good Practice

1. Improving Participation in the Curriculum

St Mary's offers a broad and balanced curriculum using multiple approaches to ensure all pupils can participate in the curriculum:

- Our school offers a differentiated curriculum for all pupils
- We use resources tailored to the needs of pupils who require support to access the curriculum
- Curriculum resources include examples of people with disabilities
- Curriculum progress is tracked for all pupils, including those with a disability
- Targets are set effectively and are appropriate for pupils with additional needs
- The curriculum is reviewed to ensure it meets the needs of all pupils
- · School visits are planned to ensure inclusivity
- School clubs are organised to provide a broad spectrum of activities
- Children with potential SEND needs are identified as early as possible through thorough assessment, including within the Early Years classes
- Details on pupils with SEND are shared with all teachers and support staff working with them
- Teaching assistants are employed to support individual pupils, when appropriate
- Our staff have access to Continue Professional Development training opportunities relating to SEND

2. Improving the Physical Environment

St Mary's School environment has been adapted as follows:

- Lift access to the upper floor.
- · Ramp between split levels in the playground.
- LED lighting in corridors
- Disabled parking space available
- Disabled toilet available
- Wide corridors for access
- Wheelchair accessible height library shelves
- Interactive white boards in all classrooms
- Smaller meeting rooms are available for quiet times or 1:1 sessions

3. Improving the Delivery of Written Information

St Mary's uses a wide range of communication methods to ensure information is accessible. This includes:

- Large print resources
- Pictorial or symbolic representations
- Information and resources clearly published on the school website

- An outline of the curriculum to be covered in each class each term circulated to parents
- A fortnightly emailed newsletter
- Paper copies of any information are also available on request
 A direct email address for each class to enable effective and fast communication between class teachers and parents

Appendix: Review of Accessibility to the Building and Grounds

Classrooms

We currently have eight classrooms, and three small group rooms. Access to two group rooms currently involves several changes in level. Flexibility over the allocation of classrooms to different year groups is possible however at present classroom provision is as follows:

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Unit: This has level access from the outside EYFS area. A wheelchair user would be able to both access and manoeuvre around the classroom. Extra equipment such as a special desk could be accommodated.

Year 1-4 Classrooms: These classrooms have level access through the front entrance of the school. The classrooms are fairly spacious which is important when thinking about wheelchair manoeuvrability or installing special equipment.

Year 5 & 6 Classrooms: The classrooms have steps leading to them restricting access.

The Hall

The Hall is upstairs, however, there is a wheelchair accessible lift giving access.

Toilets

There are two sets of boys and girls toilets in the school, one set has level access. The others have steps leading to them restricting access, however the disabled toilet is fully accessible.

Additional Rooms

The Head Teacher's Office, School Office, Staff Room, Meeting Rooms, Store Rooms, Cleaners Store and Photocopy Room all have level access. Two of the meeting rooms are quite small, limiting manoeuvrability, as are the store rooms, photocopy room and cleaner's store.

Playground and Sports Field

The main playground surface is a mixture of hard standing and grassed areas. A wheelchair user may find using the grassed areas difficult when the weather has been wet. There is a ramp to move between the top and lower playgrounds. The quiet garden has one step up to access it and has a wood chip flooring which may impede wheelchair accessibility. The story shack in the quiet garden is a converted shed with a narrow doorway and one step. The sports field is used for sporting and physical activities. There is level access by crossing the bridge. Children only use the field with adult supervision.

<u>Equipment</u>

Specialist equipment is provided as necessary for children with physical special needs. Pupils routinely use laptops in all areas of the curriculum and all classrooms have interactive white boards installed. This gives the school flexibility in delivering the curriculum to pupils in the best way to meet their needs.
