

Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2018-2019

The aim of the Pupil Premium Grant is to support disadvantaged pupils and close any attainment gap between them and their peers. The Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to pupils who are or who have previously been in receipt of free school meals (FSM), those that are or have been in the care of local authority (CLA) and children whose parents are in the armed services.

4% of children on roll in Key stage 1 and Key stage 2 are currently eligible for Pupil premium grant.

Progress of all pupils is tracked and monitored regularly at termly pupil progress meetings, in addition class teachers meet with the SENDCo to discuss progress and possible barriers to learning. These discussions inform our decisions about planning appropriate provision.
