Audiology Service Updates

Your child's clinic might have already contacted you, but here is the information we have currently as of 06.04.20.

Yorkshire Auditory Implant Service

- All routine face to face appointments have been cancelled as far as the end of April, and patients have been notified by telephone. Switch on and six week appointments are still being scheduled at the moment, if patients are well and able to come. However only one parent is allowed to attend appointments.
- Letters have been sent out to parents of children on assessment to say that the process is currently on hold due to the Covid 19 outbreak.
- Letters have been sent out to patients who might be expecting a routine appointment in the coming weeks, explaining that these will also be on hold for now.
- The YAIS is trying to maintain a skeleton service to deal with spares and repairs and keep patients' hearing. If you have any issues, please ring rather than coming to the centre. YAIS would like people to post equipment in, but if it is brought in person there are strict measures in place which patients must follow. The instructions are clearly displayed on the doors at YAIS. Patients with equipment are not allowed in the building.

Sheffield Children's Hospital

- Similarly, all routine and face to face appointments are cancelled apart from for the most urgent cases. The hospital is still offering phone appointments, if something is not working or you suspect a change in your child's hearing levels. Currently however, there is no testing taking place of hearing thresholds or any facility for ear mould impressions to be taken.
- Faulty aids: a replacement can be sent out in the post. Also new tubing and batteries can be posted out. If your child loses their ear mould, the hospital might be able to send out a replacement. Please contact them for further details.
- The hospital is maintaining a skeleton service. Someone will check phone messages every day on either 0114 271 7450 (main number) or 0114 271 7462 (workshop).

- Please phone 01226 644804 to inform paediatric audiology about any repairs. Any faulty hearing aids can be dropped off at New Street Health Centre and a replacement picked up from there.
- If your child has lost their ear mould, again please phone paediatric audiology to enquire whether they can order a replacement.
