Community and Family

 Children know about members of their immediate family and community

LKS2

Local History:

- Children know the schools in Darfield in the past.
- Children know about employment in Darfield during three different time periods.
- Children can study a significant individual from the past who influenced life in the community.

Coal Mining:

• Children know the impact that mining had on the local area.

The Raman Empire:

- Children know family was extremely important and all members of the family would live under one roof including slaves/servants.
- Children know ancient communities had a hierarchy and even dressed differently.

Anglo Saxons and Vikings:

- Children know people in Anglo Saxon communities had different roles.
- Children know that we can learn about houses in Anglo Saxon Britain from Sutton Hoo
- Children know roles of women changed during Viking times.

KSI

Local History:

- Children know the oldest building in Darfield is All Saints Church.
- Children know toys and household items that our grandparents would have used in the past.
- Children know that we can learn about the past from the Maurice Dobson Museum in Darfield.

Remembrance:

- Children know we wear a poppy to show support for the Armed Forces community. We also remember family members and loved ones affected by war.
- Children know people visit local cenotaphs and war memorials to pay respect to soldiers who fought and died in the war.
- Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole:
- Children know that Florence Nightingale had a significant influence on the community in the Crimean War. She also developed nursing standards.
- Children know that we remember Mary Seacole for helping wounded soldiers and providing a caring community in her hotel.

UKS2

Stone Age to Iran Age Early Stone Age:

Children know families lived a nomadic lifestyle. What can we learn from Skara Brae? Britain's first community – farming, crops and livestock.

Branze Age:

Children know people lived in clans ruled by powerful chiefs. They gathered for religious ceremonies (Stone Henge).

Iron Age:

Children know people of the community had important roles e.g. Druids.
