Using balance and stillness to create freeze frames and show emtions in our dances

Timing

Counting our actions to create short dance. sequences using our 4 or 8 counts

Sequence

Linking balancing / jumping / travelling actions together to create a sequences of movement

Stillness/Balance

Holding a freeze frame/pose for 2+ seconds

Jumping/Leaping

Principles of dance: How can we use these to adapt our actions?

Jumps can be used as a transition between balancing and travelling actions to show sharp. explosive actions.

- Galloping
- Chassé / sidestep
- Crawling
- Jumpina
