Year 1 Fundamental Movement Skills

Curriculum area: **FMS**

Links to PE National Curriculum

- Pupils should develop fundamental movement skills, become increasingly competent and confident and access a broad range of opportunities to extend their agility, balance and coordination, individually and with others.
- Master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as
 developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of
 activities
- · Participate in team games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending
- They should be able to engage in competitive (both against self and against others) and cooperative physical activities, in a range of increasingly challenging situations

Fundamental Movement Skills overview

- Fundamental movement skills (FMS) are the basic movements traditionally associated with human physical activity.
- The most common FMS include skills such as running, jumping, throwing, catching, skipping, and hopping
- Mastery of fundamental movement skills allows pupils to then start exploring sport specific skills (SSS) in KS2

EYFS
