The Priority is to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum which is of high quality for all our pupils.

School will return to normal.

KEY POINTS:

- From the 16th August under 18-year olds will no longer be required to self-isolate.
- If someone's been in close contact with a positive case they do not need to isolate if they have had both vaccinations or are under the age of 18. They will be advised to take a PCR test.
- If a child in school tests positive they will follow government guidelines and isolate. Children in the class will not have to self-isolate.
- If a child in school begins to show any of the COVID 19 symptoms you will be contacted to come and collect your child and take them for a PCR test. If the PCR test comes back negative they can return to school. If the test comes back positive, they will have to isolate.
- If your child displays any of the COVID 19 symptoms at home don't bring them to school and book a PCR test.
- Any children who test positive will be expected to complete home learning on seesaw if they are well enough to do so.

Control measures:

- Ensure good hygiene for everyone. Handwashing/sanitising on entry and at each breaktime. Catch it, bin it, kill it!
- Maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes. Surfaces to be cleaned at break time and lunchtime.
- All occupied spaces to be well ventilated.
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolating and managing confirmed cases.

Entry into school:

End of the school day:

- Parents to enter through either the side gate or the front gate.

Breakfast club:

- Breakfast club will commence at 7:45 and the last entry to breakfast club will be 8:15.
- Breakfast club will take place in the wraparound classroom (old class 3).
- All breakfast club children to come through the side gate from 7:45. The gate will close at 8:15.
- Parents to take their child to the outside door where staff will greet them.
- The cost for breakfast club is £2 per day. All payments to be made through Parent Pay.
- Breakfast with consist of a drink, cereal and toast
- Children will be able to access different activities including drawing, reading, board games and outdoor games.

After school club:

Extra information:

- Children will need to bring a PE kit every week. This is to consist of trainers, plain black PE shorts, plain white t-shirt and plain black or grey tracksuit for the cooler weather.
- Children can bring a water bottle which must only contain water. No pop of any kind or flavoured water. If your child doesn't like water Mr Budd will speak to them.
- Tuck shop will be available at breaktime. Children will be able to buy a healthy snack which will include cheese, yogurt drink and dried fruit. In the summer months ice-pops will also be available. The cost of an item is 30p. It is the child's responsibility to look after their money.
- Homework will be on seesaw each week.
