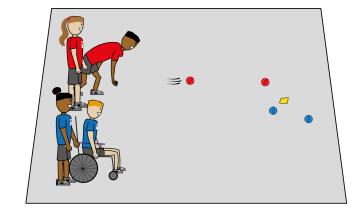

Glossary

Aim

When aiming, we want to look and make sure we/our bat is pointing towards our intended target.

Target

The target is what we are aiming for, whether that be a cone, pin, hula hoop or hole.

Accurate

When we are accurate, it means we hit the target we are aiming for.

Year 1

- · I can follow simple rules to play games fairly

- · I can work collaboratively with others
- I can work competitively against others

Year 2

- I can start to link actions together for example running, throwing and catching
- I can start to apply the correct action into games/tasks
- I am starting to show an understanding of what success looks like and how to improve
- I can demonstrate core fundamental movements with control and consistency (mastery):
- Movement skills i.e. running, jumping, skipping etc.
- Throwing
- Catching
- I can throw an object with increasing consistency towards a target
- · I can roll a ball with increasing consistency towards a target
- I can strike a ball with increasing consistency towards a target
- · I can work collaboratively with others
- I can display patience and resilience when completing tasks
- · I am willing to help others and receive feedback
- I have a basic understanding of what happens to my body as we exercise

Year 3 (Dodgeball)

- I have an understanding of basic techniques used in dodgeball
- I understand the basic rules of dodgeball
- I am willing to receive feedback, and act on it to further develop my skills
- I can throw a ball with some accuracy and consistency
- · I can catch a moving ball with some consistency
- · I am showing mastery in most, if not all FMS from KS1 including:
- Dodging
- Running
- Balance
- Throwing
- Catching
- · I can display resilience and effort when learning new skills
- I can play fairly with & against others in small games

Progression of physical skills

Year 1

- Running
- Galloping
- Side stepping
- Jumping
- Hopping
- Rolling a ball
- Underarm throw
- Kicking a ball
- Catching skills
- · Striking/batting a static ball

Year 2

- Pupils can throw/roll towards a static target with increasing consistency
- Pupils can strike a ball towards a moving target
- Pupils can apply sending skills into cooperative and competitive games

Year 3

- Throw with greater accuracy against static and moving targets
- Develop catching skills
- Developing evasion/dodging skills
- Developing attacking skills in uneven and even small sided games
- Start to explore movement off the ball (using space)
