Glossary

Key

A key is a small table at the side of our map, explaining what each symbol means.

This helps us orientate our map correctly.

Orientate

Orientating out map means to turn so we are facing the right direction and the map lines up with the key focal points around us

Navigate

Once orientated, we can then use our map to navigate and find our control points

Developing essential life skills through OAA

- Communication

- Sharing and listening
