Dear Parents/Carers and Students,

I do hope that our students enjoyed a good half term break with families at home and were pleased nonetheless to return to school on Tuesday to resume their studies, and their involvement in the rich wider life of the school.

I know that many of our students, and their families celebrated the Hindu festival of Diwali, meaning the 'rows of lighted lamps', and which today is known as the 'festival of lights'. Diwali was celebrated over half term and lasted for five days, this year between the 31st of October and the 1st of November GMT. I understand that Diwali symbolises the spiritual victory of Dharma over Adharma, light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance, and marks the beginning of the new year in the Hindu calendar. A wonderful celebration to be part of, I'm sure.

This has been an important week, I suggest, for our year 11 students, who joined us with their families on Wednesday evening, along with hundreds of external students, at our very popular sixth form open evening. Last year, the school received nearly 700 applications for a place in year 12, and amongst those applications were those from nearly every student in year 11. Each member of year 11 is guaranteed a place in year 12, subject to them meeting our strengthened entry requirements, which are 48 points, derived from a student's best 8 GCSE grades. Each student in year 11 will be given support and guidance with regards to their own post-16 plans, but I very much encourage them to seriously consider remaining at the school after completing year 11, through joining the sixth form in September 2025. Application forms, for sixth form entry, can be found on the school website, and need to be completed (online) no later than the 24th of January, 2025. On Monday, staff enjoyed a very useful training day, which included a fascinating insight into visible leadership, by former Shakespeare actor and now inspirational speaker Ben Walden, whose company Contender Charlie ([Contender Charlie](#)) works with schools, as well as with private sector companies, to inspire leadership skills and attributes in all who work in schools, and with young people. It was such a powerful session, that I aim to bring Ben back into school to undertake a similar course with our senior students in the summer.

Career planning is such an important part of the work of any school, and I am delighted that at Crypt we continue to strengthen our careers offer to all students, providing them with opportunities to learn more about the labour market, future career opportunities and pathways, whilst also equipping them with the skills and personal qualities needed to

successfully progress into the adult world of further learning and work. Whilst university remains the most popular post-18 pathway for our students, the increase in apprenticeship opportunities available at 18 now forms an important strand in our career's guidance programme. Degree apprenticeships are proving very popular with young people and at Crypt we have developed a strong programme to support those thinking of that route into their future careers. On Wednesday, interested students from year 12 and 13 enjoyed an apprenticeship workshop, organised by Mr Germaine (our careers leader), to explore further what an apprenticeship involves and what opportunities are available; anyone interested in apprenticeships should sign up to the national apprenticeship website: <https://www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship>

It was really good to welcome nearly 30 pupils from 7 local primary schools into Crypt on Thursday afternoon, as part of our primary mentoring and support programme, led by Ms De La Fuente and students from year 12. Our year 12 student mentors, having been trained in mentorship skills last term, will now put those learned skills to use supporting our primary pupil guests over the rest of the academic year. They will offer mentorship and support to help these children develop greater self-confidence and personal self-esteem, whilst supporting them in their maths and English work, as well as offering guidance and support for the grammar school entrance test, held in September each year.

Other activities have continued this week, such as the Carducci String Quartet Workshop for our Year 10 musicians, and plenty of sports fixtures taking place as well, such as senior rugby against Blundells and Sir Thomas Rich's schools, senior boy's football against Archway School, and year 11 and senior girl's netball against Ribston Hall High School. I hope all involved enjoyed the experience of playing in competitive sports fixtures. Miss Leask (our director of sport) offers a full round up of sporting news from last term in this newsletter.

However, the most significant event of the week was undoubtedly the annual School Remembrance Service, held earlier today in the Sports Hall. The Choir took centre stage, performing as always to an incredibly high standard, as the school community came together to remember and thank those 136 Old Cryptians, and all others who died in the two world wars of the twentieth century, as well as those whose lives were lost in subsequent wars and conflicts. My thanks go to our guest Reverend Steve Ward, from the Gloucestershire Methodist Circuit, for his thoughtful address and to our former member of staff, Mrs Sue Evans, for placing a moving remembrance display onto the Crush Hall table.

Rugby Overview

U12- (Mr Hart and Mr Jakes)

The Year 7A team have been excelling in all areas of rugby. Winning both games comfortably. Holmleigh park High School which was some of the teams first ever game saw a 40-5 away win and our second game against King's School Gloucester was a 20-0 win. We are all looking forward to the development of both teams and already seeing great progress. The year 7B



team have had an excellent start to school rugby! A tough first game against Holmleigh Park, in what was a lot of the pupils first ever game of rugby, was followed up by a resounding 45-20 win against King's School Gloucester. We look forward to seeing the progress of this team as a group and as individuals over the coming months and years.



U13- (Mr Jakes) Year 8 boys have had an amazing start to the year. Lots of numbers turning up to both training and fixtures. Our Year 8A team started with a loss against St. Peters, a close game and well fought to the

end from both sides. The boys picked themselves up after this loss and managed to get 2 brilliant consecutive wins. KES Stratford away saw the Year 8s win 55-5, along with the game being called early due to the dominance the Crypt boys showed. The week after playing King's School at home, with another dominant performance winning the game 40-10. We are all looking forward to the future results and development that this team will undoubtedly show this season. The 8B Team started off their season with a win against St. Peters 55-45. Then unfortunately lost against King's School, however with the boys turning up to training and fighting to be on that team sheet, the B team will continue to show promise and progress throughout this season.

U14 (Mr Hart) The Year 9 boys are progressing nicely and showing clear improvement each week. It was almost a blessing losing the game to St Peters as it highlighted areas we need to work on. This was evident in our next game against Holmleigh Park with a convincing victory. KES Stratford was a real test and coming away with a draw when down to 13 players was our best game so far. Although the team lost to King's School by 1 try the game had to be cut short due to an injury. I am confident that the team will continue to improve especially with parental help from Mr Curruthers and Mr Dix.



U15 (Mr Atkinson) The year 10 team have had a good start to the season. A dominant win over Westonbirt School in the National Vase first round was a brilliant way to start the season. The two games that followed were a narrow loss to KES Stratford and a loss in the 2nd round of the national vase



to KLB School, in what were extremely challenging conditions. However, with several injuries and lots of unavailability, the group showed fantastic spirit to bounce back with a 17-10 win

over King's School Gloucester. This is a talented group with big potential and the rest of the season should be looked at with great optimism.

U16 (Mr Stanlake) As a transition year from U16's to senior rugby the squad have acquitted themselves well. The opposition has varied between pure Under 16s to the 2nd XV, vital experiences that will stand them in good stead in the future. After a tough loss to St Peters the team responded well against a much older opposition from KES Stratford winning 61 - 0. That was then followed by a narrow defeat to King's School 2nd XV. The squad continues to develop and we look forward to seeing them develop further in term 2.

Seniors (Mr Windsor) The 1st XV have had a mixed start to the year but have nonetheless taken on all challenges that have been put in front of them. Having been drawn in the National Cup on the back of success in the previous years, they faced a well-drilled Monmouth team who showed their class in progressing to the next round. This meant the school were now into the Plate competition, where they met local Grammar school rivals Marling. A more complete performance this time around saw the school run out 32-10 winners and now await a visit from Blundell's school in the next round.



In our "friendly" fixtures this year, the 1sts have won one (v Cotswold School, 26-14) and lost two (St Peter's, 25-27. KES Stratford, 7-29). While the record is against us, the effort shown by the squad in preparation and the matches themselves have been pleasing. There are clear areas of focus for the team to improve going forward and we look forward to the challenges of the rest of the season.

Netball Overview



U12 (Miss Leask) Our Year 7 netball team have had a great start to the season. We travelled to Stroud and fielded 3 teams showing excellent commitment from this group of girls. Our 7As remain unbeaten so far this term playing against Stroud, Farmors and

Ribston and our B and C teams continue to improve each week!

U13 (Miss Burnside) Our Year 8 netball team has already progressed a lot this season. They have had a mix of both wins and losses, however they are working hard to keep consistent throughout matches. Our U13 girls commitment to training is exemplary. Unfortunately, they were knocked out of the Sisters in Sport Plate competition. We look forward to seeing how they can progress through the bowl competition next term.



U14 (Miss Leask) Our U14 girls had a mixed start to the season as they struggled to find their form. Once back into the swing of training and games they have been absolutely unstoppable. They beat a strong St Helens and St Katherines side in Oxford to reach round 3 of the national bowl which we look forward to playing after half term. Locally they have competed extraordinarily well beating Pates, Stroud and Denmark Road high School.

Our B team have also beaten a strong Stroud and Denmark team and have performed incredibly well this term both in training and matches.

U15 (Miss Leask) A slow start for our U15s after having a BYE in the first round of the national cup has meant the girls have played most of their games in the second half of the term. This group has been incredibly resilient after losing some players to injury. They narrowly missed out on progressing in the SIS plate competition by 2 goals unfortunately. The B team has really stepped up this year too with some students playing up into the As which has been great for their development too!



U16 (Miss Burnside) An outstanding start to the season from our U16 girls. The team started this year with the same determination they finished with last season. The U16s are still undefeated and have gained another trophy to add to their ever-growing collection. They are now U16 County champions! The team competed in their first Sisters in Sport game, which is part of the cup competition, and showed an outstanding performance winning convincingly. The commitment of this U16 team is unmatched and we are extremely excited to see what else they can achieve this year.

Seniors (Miss Burnside) A mixed start for our U18 team. So far winning one match and losing the other. The team competed in the U18 County tournament. They had some very difficult competition; however they came away with a win against Pates. The U18 girls are developing nicely and alongside some focused strength and conditioning they will have some great success this season.

ESFA competition. The girls managed to win their first round beating Kingstone high school 3-2 in an end-to-end game. It has been great to see so many Year 7s trying football. A reminder that the Y 7 & 8 girls football club is on every Monday at lunch time. Y7s will have

the opportunity to compete as an U12 team in the county cup competition coming up after half term.

Girls U14 Our fantastic U14 squad are now in round 3 of the national ESFA competition. They had a BYE in the first round and went on to beat Chosen Hill 6-1 in round 2 of the cup. We face The Bishops of Hereford Bluecoat school after half term. We're really looking forward to seeing how far these girls progress, they are an extremely talented bunch!



Girls U15 Another 6-1 win for the Crypt as our U15 team beat All Saints academy in very testing conditions. The girls managed to play some excellent football during an absolute downpour. We face Stonar school after half term. A reminder

Girls U18 Our senior football team had their first game of their ESFA campaign at the very start of term 1. They played some brilliant football throughout the game but unfortunately couldn't manage to put the ball in the back of the net. We unfortunately do not progress in this competition but the determination and grit from this group of girls was great to see. We will arrange some friendlies during the year to ensure they still play football.



Senior Football Senior football continues to go from strength to strength. We had almost 50 students trial to be a part of our senior football squad run by Chris Gooch (UEFA A license coach and assessor, Forest Green Rovers academy coach and England women's scout). We are extremely lucky to have Chris lead our senior football programme; the culture and ethos of the group is strong and we look forward to what they can achieve this season. They started well in the ESFA cup competition beating Tommies 6-1. The boys were outstanding in the first half, absolutely dominating the game. We play Archway in round 2 on the 7th November.



Netball dresses and sports kit:

As most parents are aware we do hand out sports kits for our students to wear. We are really proud of our school kit and we have worked really hard to gain funding to pay for the kit. Unfortunately some students are not handing back their kit after it has been worn and this is having a negative impact on other teams across the school. My First Great Job

Dale Willis, founder of My First Great Job, runs a Degree Apprenticeship Support service. This is a paid for service. The school has worked with Dale, who has previously delivered a session with Year 13. Dale says,
"Our experience is that a lot of young people who are applying for Degree Apprenticeships are 'flying solo'.....they're trying to figure out on their own how to present their CV, how to navigate a video interview, and what research to do for an assessment day.

Our Degree Apprenticeship Mentoring Programme is here to help them, and give parents the piece of mind that their son/daughter is not missing out on opportunities because of a lack of knowledge.

The 4 month mentoring programme includes small group sessions, personalised feedback and 1-2-1 action planning meetings. We're running 'Insight Sessions' so young people and their parents can find out more, and figure out whether the support we offer will work for them. We also offer an entirely bespoke 1-2-1 programme so we'll be covering that too.

This is a paid-for mentoring programme with a cost of £55 a month for 4 months for the 'group' programme. They can then click one of the links below to book a spot on one of the free 30 minute **Insight Sessions** - they'll just need to attend one of them. The next programme starts on 18th November 2024.

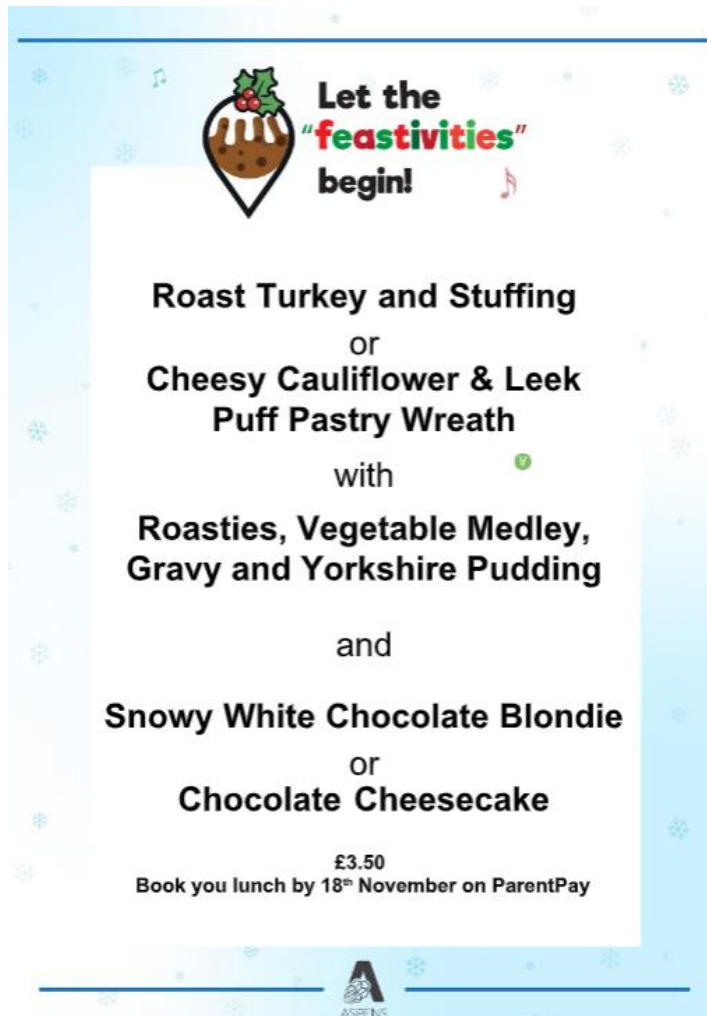

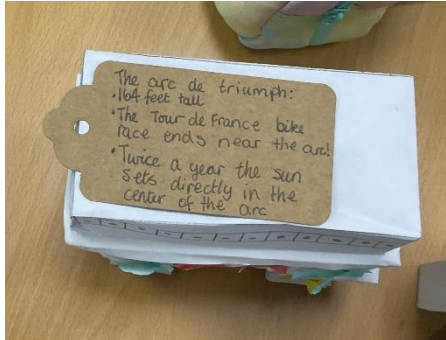
MFL Department

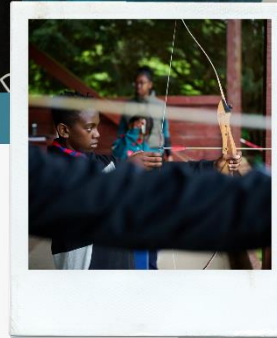
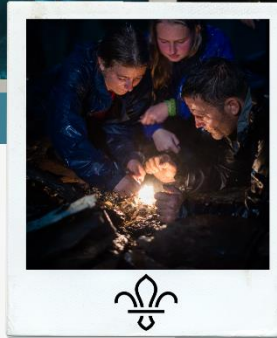
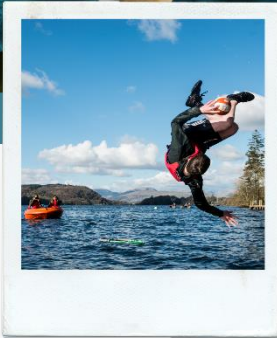
