Message from the Headmaster – Mr. Nicholas Dyer

I am delighted that you are considering applying for this important role here at The Crypt School. I do hope that you find this information helpful, and we look forward to receiving your application.

The position of PE Assistant and Sports Coach (Girls Sport) is an important one for the School and for the PE/Games department: all students enjoy and participate in the PE and sports programme at Crypt, and our girl's programme has developed strongly in recent years. Large numbers of girls participate in competitive fixtures and enjoy being part of our various teams competing in local, regional and national competitions and fixtures for example.

Founded in 1539 and set in nearly 30 acres of grounds, The Crypt School's vision is derived from its Latin motto, "Floreat Schola Cryptiensis": floreat means "to flourish" and at The Crypt we wish all our students, as well as our staff, to flourish in all that they do. In order to achieve that vision, we strive to create the best possible environment and culture within which our students can learn, develop essential key skills and personal attributes, make friends and enjoy their school lives; equally, we wish for our staff to flourish in their work at school, and always strive to place their welfare at the centre of our work and planning. The School has grown significantly over the last five years, especially since the admission of girls into the main school in September 2018. Today, The Crypt School is Gloucester's only co-educational selective school with a student roll of over 1100. The student body is a diverse, caring and enthusiastic one and our staff are a highly professional, caring and generous group of people who commit themselves fully to the academic, pastoral and extracurricular life of the School. The School is a vibrant place to both learn within and to work at; it is a place where learning is valued for its own sake, within an environment of strong pastoral care. At the centre of our school life, is a powerful sense of community, where students are supported and encouraged to learn and engage with each other. Confident, friendly and respectful, the high quality of our student's personal development is remarkable and is one of the greatest strengths of the School.

The School has benefited from significant capital investment over recent years which has enhanced the learning environment for both students and staff alike. Recent projects have included the building of two new teaching blocks and a sports pavilion; the refurbishment of the sports hall, the creation of an outdoor netball and tennis area and giving enhanced facilities to our growing sixth form, which now numbers over 330 students. Later this year, and thanks to a recent Wolfson Fund grant, two science laboratories will be completely refurbished.

In March 2024, the School received an outstanding ofsted report in all areas and our sporting and wider extra-curricular programme was singled out as being a particular strength: "Pupils make exceptionally good use of the extensive range of extra-curricular activities on offer...... they attend plays, lead debates, or compete in one of the many sporting activities on offer."

Staff work hard and give generously of their time to the life and wellbeing of the School. Time and money is invested in their professional development, and each member of the teaching staff is equipped with a laptop and iPad; other benefits also enhance the working experience of colleagues at the School (https://www.cryptschool.org/welcome/working-at-the-crypt-school

The Crypt School is located just outside of the City of Gloucester in the West of England. Gloucester is known for its 11th century Cathedral and close; for Blackfriars, which is a stunning example of a 13th century mediaeval priory site; the British Waterways Museum, which celebrates the city's industrial past, and now the vibrant Gloucester Quays, which has a selection of shops and restaurants. The Department

Purpose	The role of the PE Assistant and Sports Coach (Girls Sport) is to provide extra-curricular and learning opportunities to which all students can respond with enthusiasm and commitment and demonstrate real progress in their sporting endeavours in extra-curricular sport and games. The Role will also involve some administrative work under the direction of the Director of Sport.
Duties and responsibilities	As outlined below

Main Duties (PE Assistant):

- Manage and oversee all fixtures on a weekly basis. Confirm fixtures with opposition, book transport, notify any clashes, liaise with staff and students, update and manage SOCS (schools' fixture website www.cryptsport.co.uk).
- Be responsible for keeping a record of students' participation in extracurricular sport and updating the 100 Club to recognise those students who represent the School.
- Manage and oversee the daily use of kit within the department. Ensure all equipment is accessible and safe for use. Work closely with other PE staff to audit and order new kit when required.
- Manage and keep a record of any kit borrowed by students for fixtures etc. is returned.
- Support the Director of Sport in the running and organisation of The Crypt Sport Foundation.
- Reach out to potential sponsors and raise funds to maximise the PE and school sport offer; invoice potential sponsors and oversee the income of funds along with any potential spending to support students and the PE programme.
- Help in the organisation and running of events such as Sports Awards, Sports Day, House Events and Primary School Events.

Main Duties (Sports Coach):

- Under the guidance of the Director of Sport, the sports coach ensures curriculum coverage in games, continuity and progression in the subject and extra curricular sport for all students involved.
- Plans games lessons and extra-curricular sessions with clear objectives for learning outcomes, understands the sequence of teaching and learning in the practical subject, and effectively communicates such information to students;
- Uses appropriate teaching and learning methods to meet the needs of the subject and of different students;
- Uses the school and departmental policies and practices for assessing, recording and reporting on students' achievement in games, and uses this information to recognise achievement and to assist students in setting targets for further development;
- Ensures that information about students' achievement in previous classes and schools is used effectively to secure good progress in the subject;
- Sets expectations and establishes clear targets for students' to motivate and engage students in school sport
- Significantly contribute to the extensive opportunities offered to students.
- Establishes a partnership with parents/carers to involve them in their child's engagement with physical activity and school sport.
- Ensures that there is a safe working and learning environment in which risks are properly assessed.
- Responsible for the safeguarding and promoting the welfare of students
- Have sole responsibility for groups of students as part of the school's extracurricular programme (selecting teams, organising/ managing/ officiating fixtures and driving the school minibus to take students off site to compete in fixtures).
- Work with the Director of sport to further develop the extra-curricular provision offered to all students across all sports.
