

Last Friday saw a gathering of keen creative writers in Year 9 receiving a talk from YA novelist and podcaster Ella McLeod!





Hetty Murphy-Wright went to the Magdalena Abakanowicz exhibition at the Tate Modern Gallery as a part of her Silver Arts Award, to 'Review arts events'.

Through this section of her qualification, Hetty is showing that she has learned about the art form, how to review an arts experience and how to share her review with others.

Magdalena Abakanowicz By Hetty Murphy - Wright

A while ago I went to an art exhibition at the Tate Modern displaying Magdalena Abakanowicz' art to complete part 1 of my Silver Arts Award. It was an incredible experience, and I was so lucky to be able to go. It really inspired me to try out a more varied selection of materials and art forms.

Magdalena Abakanowicz was a Polish fibre artist who created huge sculptures using coarse sackcloth sewn and attached together. Her most used materials consisted of burlap, string, and cotton gauze. Although she died in 2017 her sculptures are still exhibited in the most prestigious institutions to this day globally, her most famous pieces being "abakans", 'Embryology", "Human Figures" and so on. Her work is absolutely extraordinary, and the amount of detail is outstanding. What I loved about this exhibition was that you could get quite close to some of her large pieces meaning that you could see how much detail was really in them and all the different colours intertwined with each other. Although she uses a variety of different art forms and materials you could clearly see a consistent theme and style throughout her work.



This is a picture taken by me of one of my favourite sculptures of hers. It was hanging from the ceiling, and you could get so close up to it, helping you see all the details that would otherwise go unnoticed. I loved the different shades of deep forest green and the loose strands that hung out of it. Although it was one of her smaller pieces it still caught my eye, maybe because it was round, and the others were more of a flat shape. This piece was also a large contrast compared to the others, as they were more vibrant and warm.

What made this gallery visit so amazing has to be the fact that her artwork was hanging all around you creating an immersive experience that felt like you were walking through some sort of maze or forest.

Mr Freud, contrastingly compared to the oil painting technique he used for 'the girl in the bed to his self-portrait (1963), he_uses a completely different technique called impasto the use of a pallet knife or brush to create a unique experience and thick texture. In this artwork, he uses a range of paint to successfully show the shadows casted on the left side of his face. Additionally, his use of orange enhances the wonderful strokes and matches parts of the background- bringing the piece together.

In general, Mr Freud uses quite earthy colours on his paintings which largely consist of nude people as well as portraits, he captures the range of tones in skin expertly using shapes to section apart his artwork. However, Freud's art varies in receptiveness - some view his work as ruthless, cruel and pitiless, whilst others view his art as honest representations of society and humanity. After evaluating his art, I can see the intensity and complicated feelings Freud expresses through his challenging paintings.

One of the first things you see when you enter the exhibition is a text that talks about Magdalena

Abakanowicz and her back story. The first sentence is "following the second world war, Abakanowicz pursued an education in painting and weaving, graduating from the Academy of Plastic Arts is Warsaw in 1945."- I hope that gives you more of a background on how she became who she is. I would definitely recommend this exhibition to anyone interested or who can appreciate art. It is worth the money to go as it is unlike any other exhibition that I have ever been to (and I have been to a lot!). At first, I wasn't sure of how much I would like it but after going I am inspired to try a larger selection of art forms and materials. I would rate this exhibition a 5/5 because it surprised me as it was not what I originally expected it to be like, it was better.








Students from Year 7 & 8 enjoy the Science club every week each Wednesday after school, starting at 3.45pm in SC8.



Dyslexia: A Very Short Introduction by Margaret J. Snowling

Margaret J. Snowling CBE is Professor in the Department of Experimental Psychology at the University of Oxford and President of St. John's College. Her research focuses on children's language and learning; specifically, the nature and causes of children's reading difficulties and how best to ameliorate them. She is also professionally qualified as a clinical psychologist and has written and edited several books.

This book:

- Introduces the exciting research surrounding dyslexia today, including analysis of the potential causes of dyslexia.
- Discusses the neuroscience of dyslexia, and what we have learned about how it works through techniques such as brain scanning.
- Weighs up the various strategies and interventions which can help people with dyslexia today, sifting the fact from the fiction.


New episode of youth-led podcast "Our Turn to Talk"



World Chocolate Day, also known as 'International Chocolate Day', is celebrated on 7th July. Some believe this is the date that chocolate was introduced to Europe in 1550.

What is the history of chocolate?

Chocolate originated in Mexico, where Olmec people grew cacao for the first time. The cacao tree species is thought to be around 100 million years old! Word of mouth tales speak of the Olmecs using cacao to make drinks, but there's no written evidence of this. Their knowledge was passed to the Ancient Maya, who lived in Mexico and Central America. WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

MODERATION GAPS

Amino has a 12+ classification in the App Store and a 'Teen' rating on Google Play. However, certain communities on the platform have little to no moderation in place – increasing the potential for more adult-themed content to reach young users. It's also possible to create an account without proof of age, raising the possibility of even younger children finding their way onto the platform.

UNSAFE CONTENT

The central concept behind
Amino is for users to share
content, then make and receive
comments on these uploads.
The level of anonymity that the
platform offers (someone's true
identity can be completely
obscured behind their username,
for instance) means that it would
be extremely difficult to stop
suggestive or outright predatory
comments and messages being
sent to young people.

INAPPROPRIATE MAGES

Like most social media, Amino offers easy sharing of images. Its community guidelines state that any suggestive photos of under-18s will be removed immediately, but of course this doesn't prevent imappropriate pictures being seen by a young person. Not all of Amino's communities are rigorously moderated, so there's a chance that some unsultable images could temporarily evade detection.

Amino is a social media platform offering a large group of subcommunities under one digital 'roof'; it was envisaged as the online version of a convention, where tans gather to celebrate a shared interest like comic books or sci-fi, for example. While many such platforms are harmless spaces for devotess of a certain TV show or video game to congregate, there are still some aspects that trusted adults should be avoided. With a focus on sharing user-generated content, the idea of Amino is for users to communicate sharing user-generated content, the idea of Amino is for users to communicate with like-minded individual s – but even that can create plenty of hazards.

MEMBERSHIP COSTS

Amino+ is a premium membership for the platform, offering a bevy of customisation options such as stickers, 'moods' to display and an exclusive profile badge. Users can also purchase one-off cosmetic Items including different styles of chat bubble or profile frames. If your child has payment methods available via their device, they could potentially make these in-app purchases without you realising.

600 As a social media app, Amino is focused on keeping its communities engaged and coming back for more. Part of this approach is encouraging people to build up 'streaks', as users are awarded 'reputation points' for logging in regularly. This type of mechanism, of course, always carries the risk of young people feeling a compulsion to repeatedly check in with the app, further increasing their screen time.



Advice for Parents & Carers

TALK ABOUT IT

If your child is old enough and chooses to download and use
Amino, it's probably wise to remind them of some online safety
basics – such as how not everyone in the digital world is who they
claim to be, for example, or not to give out personal information
online. It might also be a good idea to go into the app's settings and
disable incoming chat requests from users that your child doesn't know.

STAY UPDATED

Ensure that your child knows to report any upsetting or worrying online content they might see to you. As much as possible, try to stay aware of which communities they're joining on Amino. Most of these areas are well moderated and full of innocent conversation about common interests, but on any platform of this breadth, there's always the potential for chats to veer off into potentially harmful places.

MEMBERSHIP MEDIATION

If your child asks for an Amino+ membership but you're not entirely comfortable with that, be prepared to explain your decision in depth. Young people's sense of injustice can naturally become inflamed when their friends have things that they don't. Parents of older teens, meanwhile, might actually decide to agree to the membership request but continue to monitor

MONITOR SCREEN TIME

If you haven't already, you might want to consider setting up controls such as Family Sharing (on IOS devices) or Family Link (on Android) so, from your own device, you can keep an eye on how much screen time your child is having – and what apps they're spending it on. This can be extremely useful with regard to platforms such as Amino, which can be quite addictive and reward repeated use.


Windrush Generation Celebrate a 75 Year journey
