

Maus tells the story of Vladek Spiegelman, a Jewish survivor of Hitler's Europe, and his son, a cartoonist coming to terms with his

father's story. Approaching the unspeakable through the diminutive (the Nazis are cats, the Jews mice), Vladek's harrowing story of survival is woven into the author's account of his tortured relationship with his aging father.

Against the backdrop of guilt brought on by survival, they stage a normal life of small arguments and unhappy visits, studying the bloody pawprints of history and tracking its meaning for those who come next. Mr Read adores this book; it's such a shocking story that it almost feels otherworldly, but the honest characterisations and loveable cartoons make it all-too relatable. Suitable for ages 14+.

## Dyslexia and Me: How to Survive and Thrive if You're Neurodivergent by Onyinye Udokporo

In this book, rising star entrepreneur Onyinye Udokporo shares her story of growing up dyslexic in a society where neurodivergence was always presented as a white male issue. Onyinye discusses her experience of being diagnosed at 11 years old, starting a business the following year, gaining a scholarship to a prestigious boarding school and going on to complete two degrees by the age of 22, while also being honest about the difficulties she faced throughout including with bullying and anxiety. She shares the tips she picked up over the years for thriving with dyslexia and the strategies she used to overcome her difficulties in reading and writing well, staying organised and speaking with confidence.





#### The Social Survival Guide for Teens on the Autism Spectrum: How to Make Friends and Navigate Your Emotions by Lindsey Sterling

Build stronger social skills and take care of your emotional health at the same time. This guide can help you feel more confident-and more connected to people you care about.

It is fantastic to see so many students engaging with the homework and revision resources on Hegarty Maths.

If your child has not yet logged on to Hegarty Maths or has forgotten their password, then please ask them to follow the instructions below:

#### How do Students log in?

How does a student log in To log in, follow this process:

#### 1. Start

From the website, www.hegartymaths.com, click on "Student log in"

#### 2. School

Find your school - start typing - your school should show in the list. You can also use the postcode of the school if that's easier.

#### 3. Details

Enter First name, Last name, and Date of birth. These must be the same as the details on the school register. Names are not cAsE insEnsiTivE, so it doesn't matter if you write them in *lower* case or *UPPER* case or a *MiX*.


#### 4. Password

The first time students log in, the system asks them to choose a password which they will need to write twice. Create a memorable password so they do not forget it. Only a teacher can reset a student password, so choose carefully! (Maybe write it down inside the cover of your maths book?)

The next time the student logs in, they will just be asked for their password once.

If a student has forgotten their password, click the link to request their teacher to reset it

Students won't get the message until the next time *they* log in to HegartyMaths, so *they* must not leave their homework until the last minute!





## KEEPING YOU AND YOUR PHONE SAFE

Getting a phone is really exciting. You can stay in touch with friends and find out more about the world.

- Don't fight back, it's not worth the risk when a phone can be replaced.
- Tell us if someone robs you or tries to. It's important you get help straight away by dialling 999 using a friend or trusted adult's phone rather than contacting police when you get home. This gives us the best chance to catch the suspects, recover stolen items and make sure you're safe.
- If you don't want to talk to police – contact Fearless online, without giving your name, at www.fearless.org
- Memorise or keep a note of a parent/carer's phone number in a separate place in case of emergency.

As police officers, our job is to keep you safe and stop people who want to steal property like phones, cash, earphones and even expensive coats or trainers.

You can help us do that by being careful where you use your phone and taking care of cash and other valuable items.

#### YOU CAN HELP US PROTECT AND TRACK YOUR PHONE IF IT'S STOLEN.

#### HERE'S 3 THINGS YOU CAN DO:

 Your phone will have security features such as a passcode or fingerprint/ face ID. Make sure you use it to protect access to your phone.

#### **5 TIPS TO KEEP SAFE**

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight and in a safe place. Take care when you take them out especially near bus stops and train stations.
- Stay alert and remember earphones/headphones can distract you from being aware of someone approaching from behind you. Thieves can approach on mopeds, e-scooters and pedal cycles.
- Tracker apps can help locate your phone if it's lost or stolen. Ask a parent to show you how to set one up.
- Record the phone's IMEI number in a separate place at home. Find this by typing in \*#06#. You'll need to give this number to police if it's stolen.
