International Stress Awareness Week

What was it?

International Stress Awareness Week 2022 took place from Monday 7th to Friday 11th November. It is a major annual event focusing on stress management and campaigning against the stigma associated with stress and mental health issues. It was created by the International Stress Management Association (ISMA) in 2018 to raise awareness about stress prevention. The highlight of the week is Stress Awareness Day, which took place this year on Wednesday 9th November and featured the Online Global Stress and Wellbeing Summit. The theme this year is Working Together to Build Resilience and Reduce Stress.

At Kingsdale we have been working in partnership with an external agency (Glass Pond) with selected staff and students in small groups on well-being strategies. This is all part of our wider whole school approach to support young people with their mental health.

### Stress management tips for young people and teens:

- 1. Sleep well. Sleep is essential for physical and emotional well-being.
- 2. Exercise. Physical activity is an essential stress reliever for people of all ages.
- 3. Talk it out.
- 4. Make time for fun-and quiet.
- 5. Get outside.
- 6. Write about it.
- 7. Learn mindfulness.

UK's #1 upcycled beauty brand - in just 6 years!

When they discovered that more than 500,000 tonnes of coffee grounds that are consumed each year in the UK alone are sent to landfill, Anna and her brother Will decided to start collecting coffee from cafes across London and transforming them into skincare products. Now stocked in over 40 countries, UpCircle have had to move office twice in 2022 to accommodate their rapidly growing team. Their upcycled ingredient portfolio is also growing upcycled raspberry seeds, rose petals, hibiscus acids and oat powder are now all being rescued for their next product launches. UpCircle have extended the circular approach that they take to their ingredients to their packaging too and have now refilled 20,000 pieces of packaging via their "Return, Refill, Reuse" scheme.

#### **About STEM Futures**

Participants will take part in a range of in-person and online academic workshops, hosted by Imperial College London and partners, including:

- Masterclasses in maths and science to support students with revision.
- Summer schools in Year 10 & Year 12
- personal development and study skills workshops. This is a month-long series of careers workshops where students can meet black heritage professionals working in a range of STEM industries.
- Conferences on related topics.
- Supporting students to build their confidence when applying to research intensive universities like Imperial College London, which require an A/A\* in their chosen subject e.g., personal statement workshops/interview skills.
- Gaining insights into undergraduate level study and what it is like to be a student at Imperial College London, from university students of similar backgrounds/interests, studying a range of STEM degrees.

The Year 12 stream will launch in February half-term 2023. Year 10 will launch in early March 2023.

Student Opinion Piece: Geography in the News by Kingsdale's Sixth Form Geography Students

A Perspective on COP27 and Private Jets



As a result of the recent COP27 meetings, a key issue has been highlighted that is having an impact on our planet. There has been criticism of lots of delegates arriving at the COP27 conference in private jets. Reports show that over 100 private jets flew into Egypt between the 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> November for the meetings.

These private jet journeys are significantly contributing to an increase in people's carbon footprint as flights produce many greenhouse gases. Most private jets are very inefficient and therefore, contribute more to a person's carbon footprint compared to public airlines. The most common private jet used to attend COP27 was the Gulfstream G650 which burns 1,890 litres of fuel per hour.

These unnecessary trips are damaging the environment and if the delegates were to use commercial airlines both their carbon footprint and overall emissions would significantly drop. This would therefore benefit and support our planet.

Parents are reminded that parking in the Little Bornes/Rouse Gardens area should be avoided where possible due to local restrictions.





Find your school - start typing - your school should show in the list. You can also use the postcode of the school if that's easier.

#### 3. Details

Enter First name, Last name, and Date of birth. These must be the same as the details on the school register. Names are cAsE insEnsiTivE, so it doesn't matter if you write them in *lower* case or *UPPER* case or a *MiX*.


#### 4. Password

The first time your child logs in, the system asks them to choose a password which they will need to write twice. Create a memorable password so they do not forget it. Only a teacher can reset a student password, so they must choose carefully! (Maybe write it down inside the cover of their maths book?)

The next time they log in, they'll just be asked for their password once.

If they have forgotten their password, they must click the link to request their teacher to reset it.

They won't get the message until the next time *they* log in to HegartyMaths, so must not leave their homework until the last minute!



### KEEPING YOU AND YOUR PHONE SAFE

Getting a phone is really exciting. You can stay in touch with friends and find out more about the world.

- Don't fight back, it's not worth the risk when a phone can be replaced.
- Tell us if someone robs you or tries to. It's important you get help straight away by dialling 999 using a friend or trusted adult's phone rather than contacting police when you get home. This gives us the best chance to catch the suspects, recover stolen items and make sure you're safe.
- If you don't want to talk to police – contact Fearless online, without giving your name, at www.fearless.org
- Memorise or keep a note of a parent/carer's phone number in a separate place in case of emergency.

As police officers, our job is to keep you safe and stop people who want to steal property like phones, cash, earphones and even expensive coats or trainers.

You can help us do that by being careful where you use your phone and taking care of cash and other valuable items.

### YOU CAN HELP US PROTECT AND TRACK YOUR PHONE IF IT'S STOLEN.

### HERE'S 3 THINGS YOU CAN DO:

 Your phone will have security features such as a passcode or fingerprint/ face ID. Make sure you use it to protect access to your phone.

### **5 TIPS TO KEEP SAFE**

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight and in a safe place. Take care when you take them out especially near bus stops and train stations.
- Stay alert and remember earphones/headphones can distract you from being aware of someone approaching from behind you. Thieves can approach on mopeds, e-scooters and pedal cycles.
- Tracker apps can help locate your phone if it's lost or stolen. Ask a parent to show you how to set one up.
- Record the phone's IMEI number in a separate place at home. Find this by typing in \*#06#. You'll need to give this number to police if it's stolen.
