



Kingsdale Foundation School Admission Authority is currently consulting on admission arrangements for the school for September 2024 entry. We would welcome your views on proposed changes to our Admission Policy. An explanatory letter, draft proposed policy and relevant supporting documents are attached and can be found at www.kingsdalefoundationschool.org.uk. The main proposals are that we consider 'feeder school' status for primary schools expressing an interest and that reserve additional places for disadvantaged students in receipt of Free School Meals. Please note that the technical proposed increase in the school's admission number would maintain the school at its current size, i.e. there would be no increase in the number of students on-site. 

Read recommends Lord of the Flies by William Golding.


A plane crashes on a desert island. The only survivors are a group of school-boys. By day, they discover fantastic wildlife and dazzling beaches, learning to survive;

Institute for Research in Schools (IRIS) Pilot Project



In a place where nanotechnology and biology converge, DNA Origami introduces students to 'materials science' through cutting edge research. Young scientists at Kingsdale explore the exciting new world of DNA nanotechnology as part of this creative collaboration with the Henry Royce Institute and the Bragg Centre for Materials Research at the University of Leeds. Science students from Years 10 & 12 are beginning research in DNA origami and ionic liquids and Cosmic mining, first at Kingsdale, which will lead to a conference for schools in London in the Summer of 2023.



Severe Weather in India

Recently, severe cold waves have hit north India, causing temperatures to drop to -6C creating many issues. Transport has been massively affected, while dense fog and low temperatures have disrupted train schedules. Trains are one of the main forms of transport around the country and these delays have caused massive chaos. The fog has also disrupted trains and buses in the city of Amritsar. The famous "Dal Lake" has partly frozen due to the cold temperatures, restricting boats carrying tourists. In some parts of Kashmir, pipelines have frozen, and road transport links have been affected.



This massively effects the supply chains, that the locals rely on. Rajasthan has also been affected by the temperature drop as farmers report disruption to their harvests, which affect the local's source of food and any trade connection they have involving their crops. These low temperatures can cause serious health issues, especially for the homeless population sleeping on the streets in India's capital, New Delhi.

Oxford University's 'Flash Fiction' Competitions in French and Spanish are now Open!

Students are asked to submit a complete story of **no more than 100 words**, in French or Spanish, for the chance to win up to £100.

Entries are judged by a panel of academics who are primarily looking for creativity, imagination and narrative flair, as well as linguistic accuracy. Pupils' language skills will be considered in the context of their age and year group: in other words, they will not expect younger pupils to compete against older pupils linguistically.

This year, in response to the amazing number of entries received last year, the competition has been expanded to include a third age category, as outlined below:

- Years 7-9 (ages 11-14)
- Years 10-11 (ages 14-16)
- Years 12-13 (ages 16-18)

The judges will award a top prize of £100, as well as prizes of £25 to a maximum of two runners-up, in each category. Certificates will also be awarded to pupils who have been highly commended by our judges. Results, as well as the winning, runner up and highly commended stories will be published on the competition blog, Adventures on the Bookshelf, where entrants give permission.

More information and links to the submission forms can be found on Oxford University's website. Pupils may only submit one story per language but are welcome to submit one story in French AND one story in Spanish if they would like to do so. For some inspiration, they can have a look at last year's winning entries in French and Spanish.

The submission deadline is 12 noon on 31st March 2023.

Natalie Haynes Short Biography

Natalie Haynes is a writer and broadcaster and – according to the Washington Post – a rock star mythologist. Her first novel, The Amber Fury, was published to great acclaim on both sides of the Atlantic, as was The Ancient Guide to Modern Life, her previous book. Her second novel, The Children of Jocasta, was published in 2017. Her retelling of the Trojan War, A Thousand Ships, was published in 2019. It was shortlisted for the Women's Prize for Fiction in 2020. It has been translated into multiple languages. Her most recent non-fiction book, Pandora's Jar: Women in the Greek Myth was published in Oct 2020, and was highlighted by Margaret Atwood.

Natalie has spoken on the modern relevance of the classical world on three continents, from Cambridge to Chicago to Auckland. She writes for the Guardian newspaper and is a regular contributor to BBC Radio 4: reviewing for Front Row and Saturday Review and appearing as a team captain on three seasons of Wordaholics. Six series of her show, Natalie Haynes Stands Up for the Classics, have been broadcast on Radio 4.




Southwark Independent Voice



School Attendance Focus

It is important to remember that it is essential for pupils to attend school to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. The pupils with the highest attainment at the end of Key Stage 4 have higher rates of attendance over the key stage compared to those with the lowest attainment. Generally, any student attending more than 95% is far more likely to achieve or exceed targets set based on prior achievements and potential. At Kingsdale, we are proud of our student attendance which is normally well above the national average and we need to all work together to sustain this.

Whilst we understand the impact Covid has been having, we need to ensure that this impact is not extended by allowing any potential small symptoms, such as colds or tiredness to prevent students from attending school. We are grateful to the many parents who understand this, and who do their best to arrange any medical appointment to have the least possible impact on time spent in school. We also extend our thanks to all those parents who use the dedicated year group absence emails to let us know of any absence by 8.30am of the morning of absence, and to help clear up any queries that may affect attendance. It could be anything from:


Venus Flytrap – flowering plant best known for its carnivorous eating habits

KEEPING YOU AND YOUR PHONE SAFE

Getting a phone is really exciting. You can stay in touch with friends and find out more about the world.

- Don't fight back, it's not worth the risk when a phone can be replaced.
- Tell us if someone robs you or tries to. It's important you get help straight away by dialling 999 using a friend or trusted adult's phone rather than contacting police when you get home. This gives us the best chance to catch the suspects, recover stolen items and make sure you're safe.
- If you don't want to talk to police – contact Fearless online, without giving your name, at www.fearless.org
- Memorise or keep a note of a parent/carer's phone number in a separate place in case of emergency.

As police officers, our job is to keep you safe and stop people who want to steal property like phones, cash, earphones and even expensive coats or trainers.

You can help us do that by being careful where you use your phone and taking care of cash and other valuable items.

YOU CAN HELP US PROTECT AND TRACK YOUR PHONE IF IT'S STOLEN.

HERE'S 3 THINGS YOU CAN DO:

 Your phone will have security features such as a passcode or fingerprint/ face ID. Make sure you use it to protect access to your phone.

5 TIPS TO KEEP SAFE

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight and in a safe place. Take care when you take them out especially near bus stops and train stations.
- Stay alert and remember earphones/headphones can distract you from being aware of someone approaching from behind you. Thieves can approach on mopeds, e-scooters and pedal cycles.
- Tracker apps can help locate your phone if it's lost or stolen. Ask a parent to show you how to set one up.
- Record the phone's IMEI number in a separate place at home. Find this by typing in *#06#. You'll need to give this number to police if it's stolen.
