Fireworks Warning

Watching fireworks is great fun but as Bonfire Night and Diwali approach, we would like to remind parents to take care as children are more likely to get hurt by fireworks than adults.

Did you know?

- The most common injuries are to hands, followed by the eyes and face.
- Over 500 children under 16 are rushed to A&E in the four weeks surrounding Bonfire Night.
- Many more boys than girls are injured by fireworks, especially boys aged 12 to 15.
- Most injuries happen at family bonfire parties or private displays.
- Fireworks are deemed as Offensive Weapons by the school. Possession of such items in or within our environs by a students will result in a recommendation for permanent exclusion from the school and a referral to the police.





October: ADHD Awareness Month

ADHD is one of the most common mental health conditions affecting children and adults but it is often misunderstood. ADHD Awareness Month's goal is to correct these misunderstandings and highlight the shared experiences of the ADHD community. We would like to share some MYTHS and FACTS to raise awareness.

MYTH: People with ADHD just can't concentrate

FACT: Individuals with ADHD can concentrate when they are interested in or intrigued by what they are doing.

MYTH: ADHD is over diagnosed

FACT: The rates with which ADHD is diagnosed vary so much primarily due to diagnostic criteria and measurement methods used.

MYTH: Only boys have ADHD

FACT: Boys are diagnosed two to three times as often as girls, but about 4.2% of girls have received a diagnosis of ADHD at some point in their life (and that's not none!).

MYTH: ADHD medication is addictive

FACT: The therapeutic use of stimulant medications for ADHD prevents addiction.

MYTH: ADHD is caused by bad parenting

FACT: Parents do not cause ADHD. The disorder comes from the accumulation of many environmental and genetic risk factors. Brain-imaging studies show that differences in brain structure and wiring cause problems with attention, impulse control, and motivation.

MYTH: ADHD is just an excuse for laziness

FACT: ADHD is really a problem with the chemical dynamics of the brain and it's not under voluntary control.

MYTH: All children grow out of ADHD

FACT: Significant symptoms and impairments persist in 50-86% of people with ADHD.

MYTH: Everyone has a little ADHD

FACT: Everyone does not have a physical difference in their brain.

MYTH: Children with ADHD just need more discipline

FACT: Discipline and relationship problems are the consequences of ADHD behaviour problems in the children, not the cause.

National Braille Week: 10th-14th October 2022

National Braille Week provided a wonderful opportunity to engage pupils with a unique writing system they may never have experienced before and raise their awareness of diversity. Braille was invented by Louis Braille at the age of 15 after he was blinded in a childhood accident. In 2015, the UK introduced a modified version of Unified English Braille (UEB) to help bring consistency to those using English-language material throughout the world.

What is braille?

Braille is a tactile writing system that was developed for blind and visually impaired people to help them communicate. Embossed paper is normally used to help users 'read' with their fingertips as opposed to their eyes. The braille alphabet has been used as a form of communication since the 1800s, based on an earlier form of language known as Night Writing.

Geography In The News By Kingsdale's Sixth Form Students

> Wildlife Abandons 'Europe's Amazon' Nature Reserve Read the BBC article here.

The social and economic costs of Russia's invasion of or 'Special Operations' in Ukraine are what most people have been speaking about in recent times, but what has gone almost unnoticed is the damage that has been dealt to many rare species of animals and flowers located in Ukraine's Drevlyansky nature reserve, caused by Russia's alleged excessive and destructive use of weaponry and landmines.



Ukraine's nature reserve is home to marshes, lakes, woods, and heathland, and is so rich in wildlife that it has even been named 'Europe's Amazon'.

Artillery shells caused forest fires that have burnt over 2,000 hectares of previously-untouched forest, which caused local wildlife to scatter, and incinerated many recently discovered orchids and many other extraordinary plants.

Also, many unpaved tracks have now been deemed too dangerous to use, as the Russians have planted more than seven types of mines, which is not only a danger to the nearby wildlife, but to the Ukrainian citizens as well.

As a result of these damages to the wildlife, which have caused a large decrease in biodiversity, there are fears that it will take decades to fully recover the area and make it safe again.

If your child has not yet logged on to Hegarty Maths or has forgotten their password, then please ask them to follow the instructions below:

How do I log in?

How does a student log in To log in, follow this process:

1. Start

From the website, www.hegartymaths.com, click on "Student log in"

2. School

Find your school - start typing - your school should show in the list. You can also use the postcode of the school if that's easier.

3. Details


Enter First name, Last name, and Date of birth. These must be the same as the details on the school register. Names are cAsE insEnsiTivE, so it doesn't matter if you write them in *lower* case or *UPPER* case or a *MiX*.

4. Password

The first time you log in, the system asks you to choose a password which you will need to write twice. Create a memorable password so you do not forget it. Only a teacher can reset a student password, so choose carefully! (Maybe write it down inside the cover of your maths book?)

The next time you log in, you'll just be asked for your password once.

If you have forgotten your password, click the link to request your teacher to reset it. They won't get the message until the next time *they* log in to HegartyMaths, so **don't** leave your homework until the last minute!

Diwali falls on Monday 24th October 2022.

Diwali is an important religious festival originating in India. People often think of Diwali as a Hindu festival, but it is also celebrated by Sikhs and Jains.

Diwali takes place annually and lasts for five days, marking the start of the Hindu New Year. The exact dates change each year and are determined by the position of the moon – but it usually falls between October and November.

The word Diwali (or Deepavali as it's sometimes called) means "row of lights" in an Ancient language of India, called Sanskrit. During this festival, people decorate their homes with lights and oil lamps, called Diyas.

For many people, Diwali honours the Hindu goddess of wealth, Lakshmi. The lights and lamps are said to help Lakshmi find her way into peoples' homes, bringing prosperity in the year to come!




A Celebration of Black People and Their Achievements

Now, Black History Month has expanded to include the history of not just African and Caribbean people but black people in general.







KEEPING YOU AND YOUR PHONE SAFE

Getting a phone is really exciting. You can stay in touch with friends and find out more about the world.

- Don't fight back, it's not worth the risk when a phone can be replaced.
- Tell us if someone robs you or tries to. It's important you get help straight away by dialling 999 using a friend or trusted adult's phone rather than contacting police when you get home. This gives us the best chance to catch the suspects, recover stolen items and make sure you're safe.
- If you don't want to talk to police – contact Fearless online, without giving your name, at www.fearless.org
- Memorise or keep a note of a parent/carer's phone number in a separate place in case of emergency.

As police officers, our job is to keep you safe and stop people who want to steal property like phones, cash, earphones and even expensive coats or trainers.

You can help us do that by being careful where you use your phone and taking care of cash and other valuable items.

YOU CAN HELP US PROTECT AND TRACK YOUR PHONE IF IT'S STOLEN.

HERE'S 3 THINGS YOU CAN DO:

 Your phone will have security features such as a passcode or fingerprint/ face ID. Make sure you use it to protect access to your phone.

5 TIPS TO KEEP SAFE

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight and in a safe place. Take care when you take them out especially near bus stops and train stations.
- Stay alert and remember earphones/headphones can distract you from being aware of someone approaching from behind you. Thieves can approach on mopeds, e-scooters and pedal cycles.
- Tracker apps can help locate your phone if it's lost or stolen. Ask a parent to show you how to set one up.
- Record the phone's IMEI number in a separate place at home. Find this by typing in *#06#. You'll need to give this number to police if it's stolen.
