#### Art in Geography?


Our fantastic geographers in class 12B/Ge1 have recently been practising their geographical field work skills in the classroom.

- Provide opportunity to apply key terminology to a real place.





Ramadan Observance: Dhuhr

For those who observe Ramadan, Kingsdale wishes you a blessed month. Kingsdale supports students observing Ramadan and are happy to encourage them to use the Prayer Room for Dhuhr during this special time. Dhuhr is one of the obligatory prayers that can be prayed over a three-hour window (at this time of year in England)) in the early afternoon until the next prayer; Asr. When the clocks go forward, Dhuhr will start just after 1pm during the Year 9 lunchtime (students in Year 9 can use their lunchtime for prayer if they so wish). Students in Years 7, 8, 10 and 11 who wish to pray their Dhuhr prayer during their Period 5 lesson need to obtain an individualised pass from their Heads of Learning. This can be acquired by parents/carers contacting Heads of Learning confirming permission to miss no more than 15 minutes for ablution and prayer prior to returning to class. Students will be issued with a Prayer Pass confirming permission and enabling them to go to the Prayer Room. Students are required to catch up with any work missed. ### Guidance for submissions

The Young Artists' Summer Show is a great opportunity to engage creatively with young people, offering them the chance to make and share a piece of artwork that truly expresses their own voice. There is no theme and we accept artworks of any kind. A drawing, painting, print, photograph, sculpture, textile piece, video, performance piece, or surprise us!

Judges are looking for imagination, originality and skill. Although many great artists 'copy' in creative ways, artworks that closely reproduce another artist's work or ideas won't be selected.

Each submission can include a short written statement, written by the artist themselves (if possible) and can include why they created the work and what it means to them.

A good image of the artwork is very important and could influence the way that the artwork is viewed by the judges. Read our 'How to photograph your artwork' document for some helpful tips and tricks.

**Teachers,** if you intend to submit artwork for each student in your class, we advise against submitting works that are visually similar.

Supporting young artists to create and submit original artworks is an achievement and something worth celebrating, even if their work isn't selected. We enjoy seeing each and every artwork that is sent and can't wait to see what is submitted this year!

At school, we have shared the key messages about keeping safe with the students. Some of the key messages are outlined below:


### "LOOK UP LOOK OUT"

- BE AWARE of your surroundings.
- BE AWARE when using your mobile phone.
- Know your route home.
- · Keep to busy roads.
- Try to be with other people.
- If someone tries to stop you keep walking.
- SHOUT for help and make NOISE.
- If anything happens speak to a trusted adult as soon as you can.
- RUN HIDE TELL.
- There is no right or wrong response as each situation is different but remember that YOUR SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT.
   Only YOU can assess the risk.
- Possessions are replaceable, but you are not.

Your child must contact the Police immediately on 999 if they are concerned about their safety or if they are the victim of a mugging/attempted mugging.

We would like to take this opportunity to once again remind students and their families of our two confidential emails which are operational both during and outside of school hours.


This provision is available for any member of our school community wishing to seek advice, discuss any matters relating to mental health & well-being or report an incident or concern confidentially via email.

### KEEPING YOU AND YOUR PHONE SAFE

Getting a phone is really exciting. You can stay in touch with friends and find out more about the world.

- Don't fight back, it's not worth the risk when a phone can be replaced.
- Tell us if someone robs you or tries to. It's important you get help straight away by dialling 999 using a friend or trusted adult's phone rather than contacting police when you get home. This gives us the best chance to catch the suspects, recover stolen items and make sure you're safe.
- If you don't want to talk to police – contact Fearless online, without giving your name, at www.fearless.org
- Memorise or keep a note of a parent/carer's phone number in a separate place in case of emergency.

As police officers, our job is to keep you safe and stop people who want to steal property like phones, cash, earphones and even expensive coats or trainers.

You can help us do that by being careful where you use your phone and taking care of cash and other valuable items.

YOU CAN HELP US PROTECT AND TRACK YOUR PHONE IF IT'S STOLEN.

### HERE'S 3 THINGS YOU CAN DO:

 Your phone will have security features such as a passcode or fingerprint/ face ID. Make sure you use it to protect access to your phone.

### **5 TIPS TO KEEP SAFE**

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight and in a safe place. Take care when you take them out especially near bus stops and train stations.
- Stay alert and remember earphones/headphones can distract you from being aware of someone approaching from behind you. Thieves can approach on mopeds, e-scooters and pedal cycles.
- Tracker apps can help locate your phone if it's lost or stolen. Ask a parent to show you how to set one up.
- Record the phone's IMEI number in a separate place at home. Find this by typing in \*#06#. You'll need to give this number to police if it's stolen.



### Neurodiversity in the workplace

- Hewlett Packard Enterprise conducted a program that showed that the neurodiverse teams are 30% more productive than the others.
- Research from a 2018 Deloitte report found that companies with inclusive cultures were six times more likely to be innovative and agile.
- A report by JPMorgan Chase found that professionals in its Autism at Work initiative made fewer errors and were 90% to 140% more productive than neurotypical employees.
- Organizations that provide mentors to professionals with a disability reported a 16% increase in profitability, 18% in productivity, and 12% in customer loyalty.






Are you struggling with Science Homework?



# Top Tips for Adopting SAFE & HEALTHY ONLINE HABITS

Everyone has so much going on in their lives, and that includes children: from exams and deadlines to anxiety and mental health struggles. It's quite easy to send memes, make jokes and vent online about the things that irritate us, but when was the last time you – or your child – took a moment to share something kind or positive instead? In fact, when did you last stop and think about your family's online activities? To help keep them safe and teach them healthy online habits, we need to develop our children's digital resilience. There are lots of ways that children can become more digitally resilient, and we've pulled together some popular strategies here ...

### WHAT IS DIGITAL RESILIENCE?

Resilience doesn't mean being so tough that nothing gets to you, and it's not about "putting up with things" either. Instead, it's the ability to recover from setbacks. Everyone feels sad, worried, scared or upset at times: it's how we respond and adapt to those situations which is important. Digital resilience is about making choices that keep us safe and happy online, even when we're exposed to something negative or upsetting. Building your child's digital resilience will help reduce the impact of potential risks as they engage with and navigate around the online world.

### MAKE POSITIVE LIFESTYLE CHOICES

- Make time for the people and things that make you happy.
- Monitor your screen time and stick to your limits.
- On social media, follow people that make you feel good about yourself – and unfollow the ones who don't.
- Spread some positivity: post good reviews, leave encouraging comments and share good news.

#### KEEP YOUR HEALTH IN MIND

- Try to factor in regular breaks offline and away from your screen – ideally, outdoors for some revitalising fresh air.
- Exercise is a brilliant stress-buster: even a walk around the block, a bike ride or a stroll to your local shop can really work wonders.
- Be strict with yourself about putting devices away in plenty of time before bed: they can interfer with a good night's sleep, which is essential for staying healthy.

### **REACH OUT FOR SUPPORT**

- If you have a problem online, don't be afraid reach out to specialist people or organisations that could help.
- Follow people on socials who have the same values and morals as you.
- You could always talk to a friend, or a trusted adult like a teacher or family member for some advice.

#### **PUT SAFETY FIRST**



- If you see something online that upsets or worries you, tell a trusted adult about it as soon as possible.
- You could also report the content that's making you feel uncomfortable to the site or app that you saw it on, so they can look into it.
- Another option is to block the person or the account that's causing you a problem – or you could go one step further by totally deleting the app you were using.

#### GET THINGS CLEAR IN YOUR HEAD



- Ask yourself what kindness online actually looks like. Can you remember the last time someone was kind or supportive towards you online? What did they do?
- Think about how it makes you feel when someone sends you a positive or funny message online.
- What about the opposite: has someone ever been deliberately unkind to you online? What did they do and how did it make you feel?
- If someone's behaviour online is causing you stress, try to remind yourself of all the steps you can take if a person's being unkind online.


