Arts Award:

Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is open to young people aged 11 to 25.

To achieve a Bronze Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual arts log or portfolio of their experiences of:

- ☐ developing their interests, knowledge and skills through actively participating in any art form
- ☐ experience of at least one arts event/experience as an audience member and their review of that event/experience
- ☐ researching the career and work of an artist or craftsperson that inspires them
- ☐ experience of passing on an arts skill

Camera Club

A hands-on, fun club for young budding photographers and photographic artists. Students will learn how to use a DSLR camera, set up and use studio lighting, and creatively edit images, including collage, photomontage, and a variety of digital and analogue techniques.

Year 7 Textiles:

A fun club where students will learn an experimental approach to textiles. Through responding to artists, students will develop skills in hand and machine embroidery, printing, knitting, crochet, weaving, and 3D soft sculpture.

Graffiti Club

Unleash Your Inner Artist! Join our Graffiti Club and dive into the vibrant world of street art. Learn various graffiti styles, master the art of creating unique characters and tags, and explore your creative potential. Collaborate with talented artists, attend exciting workshops, and push the boundaries of your artistic skills.

Young Makers

This club is all about making and gaining confidence and skills using hand tools and basic workshop machines. Whilst at the start of the year all students do very similar outcomes, the aim is to allow individuals to explore and challenge themselves towards the end. We will start with timber and progress towards adding acrylic and laser cutting.

CAD/CAM Club

The idea of the club is to develop the student's skills and confidence using 2D and 3D software, to allow them to use the laser cutter and the 3D printer with the same ease as pen and paper. The club is aimed at year 9 and 10 D&T and Graphics students, however we are open to anyone.
