

KS3 Art Scholarship Programme

The KS3 Art Scholarship programme at Kingsdale Foundation School is an internal programme that enables our Year 7 and 8 scholars to have access to accelerated learning practices in the various disciplines. The after-school scholarship clubs are designed to broaden the participants' knowledge of Art and enhance their technical expertise.

The Art Department offers four areas of specialism: Fine Art, Textiles, Photography and Graphics. Within the department we have 12 specialist teachers. The facilities we offer include a specialist ceramics studio with attached kiln room, a specialist photography studio and computer suite with both Mac and PC packages, a darkroom and eight general art studios that are used for painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, graphics and textiles.



Those students who gain a scholarship will participate in a wide range of exciting and inspiring sessions including:

- After school scholarship clubs.
- Workshops and master classes delivered by external artists visiting the school.
- Art trips, including our annual trip to the seaside.
- Workshops and master classes delivered by well-known art institutions such as The Dulwich Picture Gallery, The National Portrait Gallery, The Courtauld Institute, City & Guilds, and the UAL.
- The scholarship students curate and hang their work in the annual school summer Art exhibition.

Any student wishing to apply for an Art Scholarship will be invited to submit a portfolio of their work after the Autumn term half term. All parents/ carers/ guardians will be sent information about this at the relevant time. Three-dimensional work should be photographed and presented in the portfolio. We would also encourage the students to include sketchbooks or any supporting work.
