


























Student Meditation & Mindfulness Sessions

Advanced Mathematics Support Programme

Girls into Maths Careers



The Advanced Maths Support Programme invited ten of our Year 8 female students from Kingsdale Foundation School recently to join them at London at Imperial College for a day of exploring careers in maths. This event allowed our students to see the application of mathematics outside of the classroom. The morning sessions included presentations from a variety of female guest speakers who gave students an insight into how they use mathematics in their professional lives, including a Radiology Physicist with the NHS, a Security Analyst at Just Eat and a Principal and Consulting Actuary.

Our students also enjoyed a practical workshop where they learned about the world of data journalism, as well as a workshop presented by a NASA space scientist who shared astonishing images and experiences of a moon landing expedition.

The girls then designed, produced and tested their own moon-landing helicopters.

Laura, Year 8, said, "The whole day was really fun and I'm definitely going to study maths after GCSE!" and Minnie added "The women in maths were very inspiring and the whole trip was very enjoyable."

This was a wonderful opportunity for our girls and we are confident that such experiences will continue to foster a love of learning beyond the classroom and encourage wider participation in studying Further Mathematics at A Level, leading to successful careers (some of which don't currently exist!) centred around the Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) subjects.

Friday Islamic Prayer Time (Jumu'ah)

The PE changing rooms in the LLC Building will be open for wudu/ablutions from 12.50 – 13.00. Prayer and Khutbah (sermon) will be from 13.00 – 13.25 led by a Kingsdale School Imam. Students must return to class by 13.30 at the latest.



Duke of Edinburgh's Award Update

BRONZE AWARD

- 1. Students who are in Years 9 13 and are not yet enrolled on the scheme are welcome to join the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award next academic year as the original deadline has expired (31st Oct 2023).
- 1a. All 275 newly enrolled participants for the Bronze Award will have now:
 - Been added to the Bronze DofE MS Teams site where all information about how to start/current events etc. is posted both in the 'chat section' and the 'files section'. Please look here for help and advice.
 - All parents have access to the above information (deadlines and requirements to be sent out separately re the expedition in 2024) on the school intranet site under the Duke of Edinburgh's Award section.
 - Please remember the KEY cut off dates of 30th April and 14th July 2024. See details on the above sites.
 - Please check ALL parental emails for your child's DofE Welcome Pack. All 275 Bronze awards were purchased on Thursday/Friday 9th/10th November 2023. A link was sent from the award to the email address of the person who received the link to pay for the award.

SILVER AWARD

- 2. Students who have completed their Bronze Award and who are considering joining the Silver Award programme will have received a direct email from Mr Dennington before 30th November 2023 offering them the chance to pay for the new award by 4th Jan 2024. This date was for potential new students to join and not for those who have already paid and joined the Silver Award.
- 2a. All Silver Award students will have now:
 - Been added to the Silver DofE Award Team, where, as usual, all information / deadlines etc. are written.
 - Had their Silver Awards purchased in the week of 8th January with welcome packs sent to the school's designated 1st contact email account. Therefore, please ensure that you check all parental emails for your child's DofE Welcome Pack in that week.
 - All parents have access to the above information (deadlines and requirements to be sent out separately re the expedition in 2024) on the school intranet site under Duke of Edinburgh Award section.
 - Please remember the key criteria in order to be invited out on expedition are that your child must have completed their Bronze Award fully and uploaded a good assessor report for at least one of their activities by 30th April 2024. All 3 activities that they intend to engage in should have be written up fully on their DofE platform.

Unifrog brings into one place, every undergraduate university course, apprenticeship and college course in the UK. Additional opportunities include School Leaver Programmes and details on every college at Oxford and Cambridge. This makes it easy for students to compare and choose the best university courses, apprenticeships or further education courses for them. They can also explore exciting opportunities further afield by looking at English taught undergraduate programmes available in Europe and the USA. In addition, the platform helps students successfully apply for these opportunities by assisting them in the writing of their personal statements, applications and CVs, as well as guiding them through the process.

How to Get Started on Unifrog?

Students access the platform by accessing www.unifrog.org using their school email address and password; they can do so from any computer, tablet or smartphone.

We would encourage parents to use the platform with your child, so they can support them through the process of deciding their next steps. In the case that students do not receive login emails or do not remember their password, they can visit www.unifrog.org/sign-in and click on 'Reset password/Resend Welcome Email'. This will trigger a reset password email on their school email account and allow them to create a password to log in.

We have also set up a parent login so that you can use Unifrog as if you were a student yourself, allowing you to support your child throughout the process.





NSPCC and Ambitious about Autism: Online safety




Online safety tips, advice and activities specifically for parents and carers of children with SEND.

Letting your child go online can be intimidating; you might worry about the different spaces they explore, the people they meet digitally and the potential for things going wrong. Being online can be positive for children and young people, including those with additional needs. So much of our communication now happens online, either by messages, in a game or through a video call. Sometimes online platforms like the apps, social media sites and games your child accesses can help them connect and make friends with new people that they might not know offline.

As a parent or carer, you play an important role in helping your child to have positive experiences online. If your child has additional needs, then this role can be even more important, and it can feel like a lot of responsibility when you hear about some of the risks young people face online.



At school, we have shared the key messages about keeping safe with the students.

Some of the key messages are outlined below:


"LOOK UP LOOK OUT"

- BE AWARE of your surroundings.
- BE AWARE when using your mobile phone.
- Know your route home.
- Keep to busy roads.
- Try to be with other people.
- · If someone tries to stop you keep walking.
- SHOUT for help and make NOISE.
- If anything happens speak to a trusted adult as soon as you can.
- RUN HIDE TELL.
- There is no right or wrong response as each situation is different but remember that YOUR SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT. Only YOU can assess the risk.
- Possessions are replaceable, but you are not.

Your child must contact the Police immediately on 999 if they are concerned about their safety or if they are the victim of a mugging/attempted mugging.

Students and Parents should also inform the school so that we can offer pastoral support and liaise with our Safer Schools Officer – PC Crampton.



What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

ONLINE FINANCIAL SCAMS & EXPLOITATION

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

PHISHING SCAMS

Scammers often use deception to obtain personal and financial information from their target. They might pose as legitimate organisations, such as pretending to be HMRC and threatening legal action for unpaid tax unless the victim provides their National insurance number. Their efforts have been getting more convincing recently, so be mindful of any unexpected or unusual emails.

IDENTITY THEFT

Criminals can manipulate someone into providing personal data, then use it to assume their identity online and commit fraud, make unauthorised purchases or engage in other illegal activities, identity theft can be accomplished by tricking victims into downloading malware that scans their device for information; by figuring out passwords to social media accounts; or through phishing scams.

FRAUDULENT INVESTMENTS

Fraudsters might lure victims into offering their hard-earned cash for a "one-ci-a-kind investment opportunity" promising high returns or quick profits – such as the many cryptocurrency scams currently circulating online. Some unscrupulous influencers have even used their status to tempt their followers into paying for courses which promise to help them become rich and more attractive.

To date, nearly 43 million UK internet users have encountered a financial scam online; roughly 20% of those victims wound up at least £1,000 out of pocket as a result. The number of con artists plying their trade in the digital world has grown in recent years (a wornying trend which, unfortunately, appears likely to continue), and their methods have become increasingly creative. It can, therefore, be difficult to recognise an online financial scam—let alone to safeguard our children against them—but it is not impossible. Our guide offers a few pointers on what to look out for.

DECEPTIVE ADVERTISING

Many online sellers use false or misleading advertising to persuade consumers to spend money or supply personal information. Certain websites, for instance, have become notorious for using attractive images to advertise their products, promising to deliver an item for a fraction of its usual price only for a cheaper-looking, poor-quality reproduction to arrive in the post instead.

SOCIAL MEDIA SCAMS

Scammers use social media to manipulate or deceive victims, often by posing as a popular influencer and exploiting their audience – such as posting a link to a 'giveaway' which actually siphons money or personal data to whoever is behind this false identity. This type of scammer commonly impersonates influencers with a younger fan-base, as children tend to make more naive targets.

#GIVEAWAY

Advice for Parents & Carers

EDUCATE YOUR CHILD

Talk to your child about the risks of online financial scams and encourage open communication about their digital activities. Make sure they know the kind of ruses that are out there, and what to look out for when encountering a potential scam. Foster their critical thinking skills – and emphasise that if something they see on the internet seems too good to be true, then it probably is.

USE PARENTAL CONTROLS

Almost all devices that children typically use to access the internet have built-in safeguards like parental controls and monitoring tools. Stay aware of the options available to you, and make use of them to shield your child from possible exploitation as best as you can. This, combined with common sense and critical thinking, should go a long way towards keeping them safe.

STAY INFORMED

Try to keep your knowledge of current and emerging scarns in the digital world up-to-date, so you can help your child stay safe. New methods of exploitation are developing all the time, but thankfully it's not all doom and gloom. There are plenty of sources – such as Ofcom – that keep a record of online scarnmers' methods, plus lists of which sites or schemes to be wary of.

PRIORITISE PRIVACY

Teach your child to value their own privacy: that is, to respect the value of their personal data and be cautious about sharing it online. It's especially important that children know to safeguard their financial details and other sensitive data – and never to provide that information to anyone online, unless they're absolutely certain that it's safe, secure and for a legitimate reason.




REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Encourage your child to report any suspicious or potentially harmful online encounters to you or another trusted adult. Make it clear that they will never get in trouble for telling you about what's happened. Fraudsters often attempt to play on children's fear of getting into trouble, so cancelling out that notion robs internet scammers of one of their greatest weapons.
