
Our students will be up against 16 other secondary schools in London and for some of our dancers in Key Stage 3, this will be their first dance competition.

'Target Oxbridge' is a free programme that aims to help Black African and Caribbean students and students of mixed race with Black African and Caribbean heritage increase their chances of getting into the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge (known collectively as Oxbridge). Since launching in 2012, Target Oxbridge has helped over

400 students to secure Oxbridge offers. The programme is open to UK-based students in Year 10. The students accepted onto the programme will be predicted at least three GCSEs at Grade 7, or will have the potential to achieve these grades but be in need of additional motivation and inspiration.'

Friday Islamic Prayer Time (Jumu'ah)

Under-12s Southwark 9s Rugby League Kingsdale v Beacon College





Eva never really wanted to be a mother; certainly not the mother of a boy named Kevin who murdered seven

of his fellow high school students, a cafeteria worker and a teacher who had tried to befriend him. Now, two years after her son's horrific rampage, Eva comes to terms with her role as Kevin's mother in a series of startlingly direct correspondences with her absent husband Franklyn about their son's upbringing. Fearing that her own shortcomings may have shaped what her son has become, she confesses to a deep, long-standing ambivalence about motherhood. How much is her fault? Mr Hutchinson found this book's commentary on modern society thought-provoking and poignant, and the book's plot keeps you gripped right till the end.

Cristiano Ronaldo is one of the greatest footballers of all time; a dream he pursued from the age of just twelve when he left his humble origins in Madeira behind. It wasn't long

before he had the biggest clubs in Europe knocking on his door, but it was Manchester United who won the race for his signature. Under the tutelage of Sir Alex Ferguson, Ronaldo developed into the complete footballer and athlete, winning three league titles and a Champions League along the way. He then became the biggest galáctico of them all when he transferred to Real Madrid for a record-breaking fee. Unprecedented success in the Champions League and a record-equalling five Ballons d'Or followed, before his sensational move to Juventus in the summer of 2018. Jason says, 'If you want to know what makes Ronaldo tick, then grab this book straight away.' It was insightful and well written and Jason would recommend it to any sports' fan. Duke of Edinburgh's Award Update

BRONZE AWARD

- 1. Students who are in Years 9 13 and are not yet enrolled on the scheme are welcome to join the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award next academic year as the original deadline has expired (31st Oct 2023).
- 1a. All 275 newly enrolled participants for the Bronze Award will have now:
 - Been added to the Bronze DofE MS Teams site where all information about how to start/current events etc. is posted both in the 'chat section' and the 'files section'. Please look here for help and advice.
 - All parents have access to the above information (deadlines and requirements to be sent out separately re the expedition in 2024) on the school intranet site under the Duke of Edinburgh's Award section.
 - Please remember the KEY cut off dates of 30th April and 14th July 2024. See details on the above sites.
 - Please check ALL parental emails for your child's DofE Welcome Pack. All 275 Bronze awards were purchased on Thursday/Friday 9th/10th November 2023. A link was sent from the award to the email address of the person who received the link to pay for the award.

SILVER AWARD

- 2. Students who have completed their Bronze Award and who are considering joining the Silver Award programme will have received a direct email from Mr Dennington before 30th November 2023 offering them the chance to pay for the new award by 4th Jan 2024. This date was for potential new students to join and not for those who have already paid and joined the Silver Award.
- 2a. All Silver Award students will have now:
 - Been added to the Silver DofE Award Team, where, as usual, all information / deadlines etc. are written.
 - Had their Silver Awards purchased in the week of 8th January with welcome packs sent to the school's designated 1st contact email account. Therefore, please ensure that you check all parental emails for your child's DofE Welcome Pack in that week.
 - All parents have access to the above information (deadlines and requirements to be sent out separately re the expedition in 2024) on the school intranet site under Duke of Edinburgh Award section.
 - Please remember the key criteria in order to be invited out on expedition are that your child must have completed their Bronze Award fully and uploaded a good assessor report for at least one of their activities by 30th April 2024. All 3 activities that they intend to engage in should have be written up fully on their DofE platform.

- 3. Years 9 to 13 any level of the award.
 - If you have already paid then I will reimburse you.
 - If you haven't paid but still wish your child to start an award, the cut-off date to email me was the same as for everyone else, 31st Oct 2023 for Bronze and 4th Jan 2024 for Silver.

UNIFROG for Careers Education
Information Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)

Kingsdale offers the online careers tool called **Unifrog** to all our students in the Lower School (Years 7 & 8), Middle School (Years 9 & 8), Upper School (Year 11) and Senior School (Years 12 & 13. Unifrog brings into one place, every undergraduate university course, apprenticeship and college course in the UK. Additional opportunities include School Leaver Programmes and details on every college at Oxford and Cambridge. This makes it easy for students to compare and choose the best university courses, apprenticeships or further education courses for them. They can also explore exciting opportunities further afield by looking at English taught undergraduate programmes available in Europe and the USA. In addition, the platform helps students successfully apply for these opportunities by assisting them in the writing of their personal statements, applications and CVs, as well as guiding them through the process.

How to Get Started on Unifrog?

Students access the platform by accessing www.unifrog.org using their school email address and password; they can do so from any computer, tablet or smartphone.

We would encourage parents to use the platform with your child, so they can support them through the process of deciding their next steps. In the case that students do not receive login emails or do not remember their password, they can visit www.unifrog.org/sign-in and click on 'Reset password/Resend Welcome Email'. This will trigger a reset password email on their school email account and allow them to create a password to log in.

We have also set up a parent login so that you can use Unifrog as if you were a student yourself, allowing you to support your child throughout the process.

The Unifrog platform is designed to support learners in making the most informed decisions about their futures and has a range of tools that are suitable for all year groups.

Each student has their own personal account that provides a wide range of information related to their interests and aspirations. Key features of the platform include:

- Exploring Pathways personality quizzes, career and subject profiles and webinars
- Recording self-reflection about extracurricular activities and key employability skills
- Opportunities search tools showing live vacancies/courses/placements for apprenticeships, universities (in the UK and abroad), FE, virtual work experience and more
- Applications tools to help students build applications for a range of pathways (e.g., CVs, Personal Statements, Common App Essays)

The programme lasts for one academic year and the aim is for learners to secure a paid job outcome at the end of this time.



Who can do a supported internship?

To join a supported internship your child needs to:

- be aged 16 to 24
- have an Education, Health & Care Plan (EHCP)
- want to find a job.



KFS Uniform Bank

Our uniform is a key part of our identity and as such we are able to help parents and carers in providing quality uniform items. Sadly, the cost of living is still rising and some families are finding it a challenge to cover all bases in bringing up a family. There is also the negative environmental impact in design and disposal within the clothing industry to consider. Kingsdale community families can acquire cleaned and sanitised pre-worn uniform blazers (Belmont Dry Cleaners in Croxted Road have been most generous with their time and costing in this matter) and other items, dependent on availability, at a much, reduced rate.

The Uniform Bank will also be open between 3.45pm and 4.45pm each Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Please, always check for availability of items prior to making a purchase. This is a rolling programme that continues throughout the entire academic year and as such we are always looking for donations. Please leave washed and folded clothes at the main Reception area. At school, we have shared the key messages about keeping safe with the students.

Some of the key messages are outlined below:


"LOOK UP LOOK OUT"

- BE AWARE of your surroundings.
- BE AWARE when using your mobile phone.
- Know your route home.
- · Keep to busy roads.
- Try to be with other people.
- · If someone tries to stop you keep walking.
- SHOUT for help and make NOISE.
- If anything happens speak to a trusted adult as soon as you can.
- RUN HIDE TELL.
- There is no right or wrong response as each situation is different but remember that YOUR SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT. Only YOU can assess the risk.
- Possessions are replaceable, but you are not.

Your child must contact the Police immediately on 999 if they are concerned about their safety or if they are the victim of a mugging/attempted mugging.

Students and Parents should also inform the school so that we can offer pastoral support and liaise with our Safer Schools Officer – PC Crampton.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

ersuasive design' refers to the techniques that companies employ to influence our thoughts and' behaviours when we're on the internet. These approaches can be spotted on websites, in apps and even as part of some video games. Persuasive design means that this content has been deliberately presented in a way that's intended to encourage you to spend your time or money (or both). These methods often prove highly effective at keeping people engaged and invested for longer than we might expect.

SCROL

POTENTIAL ADDICTION

in the digital world, persuasive design can make certain activities more addictive and harder to walk away from: some people may begin to feel anxious or irritated without access to their device or their favourite app, for example. It can also often leave users feeling isolated, as – if they spend most of their time on social media – they may start to find it difficult to talk to other people in real life. more addictive and harder to walk

MENTAL HEALTH CONCERNS

Scrolling online or gaming without regular breaks is proven to be harmful to our mental health. The constant bombardment of news stories (many of them negative), images and influencers' posts can create sensations of unease, uncertainty and FOMO (fear of missing out). Young people can get so immersed in this environment that they become less likely to spot misleading posts.

PROLONGED SCROLLING

Social media can draw any of us – regardless of age – into a continuous pattern of refreshing our screen, following posts and links down rabbit holes or reading countless comments made by others. This almiess scrolling can eat up time which could have been spent on more productive been spent on more productive activities. It could also lead younger users into areas of the online world which aren't age appropriate.

SENSORY OVERLOAD

Repetitively scrolling, clicking on links or playing games can create an unending stream of new information and visual stimuli. Put it this way: social media isn't exactly renowned as a carefree, chilled-out environment. Such overstimulation can become too much for young people to handle, resulting in sensory overload and causing them to feel stressed, overwhelmed and exhausted.

COSTLY ADDITIONS

Video games sometimes display offers for downloadable content or loot boxes which can be bought with real money. While these 'microtransactions' temptingly 'microtransactions' temptingly promise to improve a player's gaming experience, most of the time they are money sinks. Young people in particular, excited by the chance of enhancing their game, could spend quite a sizeable sum very quickly indeed.

PHYSICAL CONSEQUENCES

Hours spent sitting and scrolling means far less time moving around and getting exercise: hardly ideal for a young person's physical health. Additionally, prolonged exposure to the light given off by a phone's screen can lead to eye fettigue and discomfort, especially if viewing it in the dark. Extended phone use before bed can also impact on sleep quality, affecting mood and energy levels over the following days.



Advice for Parents & Carers

ESTABLISH LIMITS

30 Talk to your child about setting some time limits on how long they can use their phone, tablet or console in the evenings or at weekends – or perhaps how often they can go on a specific app, game or website. You could also decide to involve the whole family in creating this shared screen time agreement, making things fair (and healthier) for everyone.

NIX NOTIFICATIONS

Stop knee-jerk responses at the source by turning off push notifications and alerts. Whether it's a gaming notification or a social media update, these not-so-gentie reminders are designed to catch our attention and lure us back to our device. Switching them off – or even deleting any particularly intrusive apps – can help prevent your child from being reeled back into the online world.

ENCOURAGE MINDFULNESS

Acknowledging any addiction is key in overcoming it – and compulsive scrolling is no different. If anything mentioned in this guide sounds familiar, it could help to have an honest, open chat with your child about how much time they spend online. Get them to think about how often they scroll through social media aimlessly or habitually open it up whenever they have a spare moment.

MAKE A CHECKLIST

Considering a list of relevant questions can be an effective way of helping children figure out why they're scrolling on certain sites or consuming particular pieces of content. A checklist can prompt young people to ask themselves if they're learning anything or benefiting from this activity – or if they're wasting their time. Taking a step back can sometimes help us to see things more clearly.
