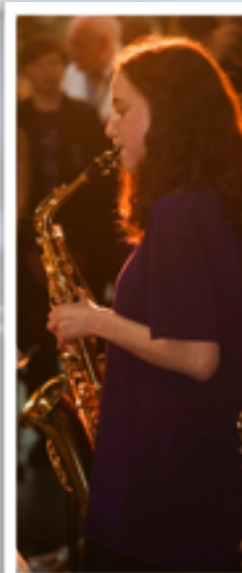
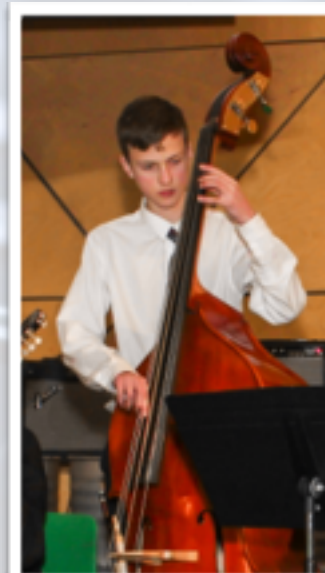

Scholarships

Music scholarships entitle you to music lessons once a week paid for by the school.

As a Music scholar you would be able to:

1. Have weekly instrumental /vocal lessons regularly
2. Attend weekly theory classes.
3. Participate in instrumental ensemble or choral rehearsals.
4. Perform in regular formal and informal concerts both in and out of the school
5. Attend organised visits to hear and see concerts, musical theatre and other such events
6. Attend workshops with Professional Musicians

The progress of pupils will be closely monitored. Music scholars are prepared for the instrumental, vocal and theory exams for the following:

Rock School.
London College of Music (Musical Theatre)
