Year 11 Mock Exam Check List December 2020

Your Y11 MOCK Exam Dates are: Monday 30th November to Wednesday 16th December 2020



Please allow plenty of time for your journey to school on exam days.



You will need to be in your Tutor room in the Year 11 Zone by 0840 for the morning exam briefing.

For the mid-morning exams and the afternoon exam, please assemble in the atrium area outside the D&T rooms. This will allow you to be briefed before being escorted to the Exam Rooms.

For Mid-morning exams, please assemble in the D&T atrium by 1130 (after break), for the afternoon exams, please assemble promptly at 1355.

All Exam Sessions are in the Main Hall and classrooms within your Year 11 Zone (as shown on your Individual Exam Timetable).



Please bring your face mask with you. We suggest you bring a clear plastic bag in which to put your mask when you remove it in the exam room.



Bags and coats should be left in Tutor Rooms – do not bring them to the exam room.



Students must not have any potential technological/web enabled sources of information i.e. mobiles phones, wrist watches or any other electronic devices in their possession whilst sitting the exam. You must not have notes, iPods, pagers, MP3/4 players, wrist watch or wrist watch with a storage device in your possession.

If you do bring phones or any watches into the exam room, you run the risk of being disqualified.



You will need to bring in the following equipment in a CLEAR PENCIL CASE or plastic bag:




- 2 x black ball pens (not rollerballs, gel pens or blue pens, erasable pens)
 - 2 x HB pencils
 - 1 x eraser
 - 1 x ruler
 - 1 x calculator (where allowed) NO LIDS to be brought into the exam room.
 - 1 x protractor
 - 1 x pair of compasses

Coloured pencils where needed

3 x different coloured Highlighter Pens


(can only be used on Question Papers <u>NOT</u> in your answers)

N.B TIPPEX/CORRECTING FLUID, TAPE or PENS IS NOT ALLOWED Do not use gel pens – this is because many of the exam papers are now scanned and sent electronically for marking – gel pens do not scan well.





- You may bring in a drink of water in a small, <u>clear</u> plastic bottle.
 Any labels must be removed. These should have a spill-proof cap.
- You may bring in sweets: these must be unwrapped and in a clear transparent bag. You must be able to eat them without making a noise.





- NO writing/ drawing on arms or hands you will be sent to wash it off losing exam time.
- CORRECTION OF MISTAKES: all crossing out should be a single line through the words e.g. incorrect
- Tie long hair back or avoid flicking it back to avoid distracting others.



CALCULATORS:

A basic scientific calculator is considered sufficient for the demands of the GCSE papers and Level 1 & 2 papers.

Calculators can be used in ALL exams unless otherwise stated on the Exam Paper Instructions.

Sshh!

There is absolutely no talking or communicating in any way between students once you enter the exam room. If you have any questions, you should raise your hand once seated and an invigilator will come to you.
